What Are the First Friday and First Saturday Devotions? The First Friday devotion is associated with the Sacred Heart of Jesus, while the First Saturday devotion is associated with the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Both devotions involve receiving Holy Communion on consecutive first Fridays or first Saturdays. The devotions are performed on consecutive months for the intention of reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary and they call on the faithful to "stand in the gap" by doing penance for sinners, and both give a special promise of dying in a state of grace and therefore obtaining heaven.




FORMED PICK OF THE WEEK
