A JEWISH PERSPECTIVE ON THE DEATH OF JESUS

Despite very cold weather, approximately 95 people attended the presentation entitled *A Jewish Perspective on the Death of Jesus* February 23 at Mary Mother of the Church. The presenter, brought to us through zoom technology, was Adele Reinhartz. Adele is a Jewish scholar at the University of Ottawa whose main research contributions have been in the study of ancient Judaism and Christianity.

The presenter demonstrated throughout her presentation a comprehensive knowledge of the New Testament in general and the passion narratives in particular. She stated that these passion narratives are hugely problematic for Jews and described them as having been "weaponized" against Jews. She drew on all four gospels to show how these stories are a problem for Jews and referred to the Gospel of Matthew, chapter 27, verse 25, the so-called "blood verse" as the most notorious in terms of Jewish-Christian relations.

After her presentation there were a number of thoughtful questions and comments which Adele fielded in an honest and respectful manner. All in all, the presentation became a priceless resource to help all Christians hear the story of Jesus' death and to understand in the words of Mary C. Boys (Redeeming Our Sacred Story) that "Rightly told, the story of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus holds power for living in the freedom to which God calls us."

Canadian Bishops and Catholic Organizations in Canada Launch Turkey/Syria Earthquake Emergency Aid Campaign

With the support of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), Aid to Church in Need (ACN), Canadian Jesuits International (CJI), Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA) Canada, and Development and Peace-Caritas Canada (DPCC) are launching an emergency aid campaign in response to the destructive earthquake that hit Turkey and Syria on Monday. They have pledged the total sum of nearly one million Canadian dollars.

"As Catholics we are compelled to come to the aid of our brothers and sisters in dire circumstances like the thousands of families that have lost loved ones, or are injured and have lost their homes, due to the earthquake," said Bishop Poisson, president of the CCCB and Bishop of Saint-Jérôme-Mont-Laurier. "For this reason, local Bishops have been invited to promote this emergency campaign in their dioceses/eparchies and to invite their faithful to donate to any one of the organizations collecting funds. These four organizations are well positioned in the region to respond quickly and efficiently with their Caritas and Jesuit Refugee Service networks, local Eastern Churches, and their many social and emergency initiatives."

"Our partners in the region know the local reality and they have been working together on the ground to support Syrian families in Syria and Syrian refugees in Turkey who have been affected by 12 years of civil war," said, Marie-Claude Lalonde, National Director of ACN, Jenny Cafiso Executive Director of CJI, Dr. Adriana Bara, National Director of CNEWA Canada and Carl Hétu Executive Director of DPCC. Funds received will be used now and in the coming months for food, medical supplies, shelter, and other essentials to meet basic human needs. These funds will also serve to meet long term needs to help families go back to a more stable life.
