




Parish Life



Today, the Church in Canada and throughout the world rejoices, as His Eminence Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost, O.S.A., after being duly elected by the College of Cardinals, has accepted to become the 267th Bishop of Rome, successor of Saint Peter, and vicar of


Christ on earth!

Taking the name Leo XIV, the Roman Pontiff, as the successor of Saint Peter, is the "perpetual and visible source and foundation of the unity both of the Bishops and the whole company of the faithful" (Lumen Gentium, no. 23). As our loving shepherd and spiritual guide, Pope Leo XIV's ministry is to orient Christ's flock toward the kingdom of heaven, where the citizenship of Christians truly lies (cf. Philippians 3:20-21).

Pope Leo XIV was born in Chicago, Illinois, on 14 September 1955. As a member of the Order of Saint Augustine (O.S.A.), in which he held various leadership positions, he dedicated many years of service to the Augustinian missions in Peru as a priest and seminary professor. He was eventually appointed Bishop of Chiclayo, Peru, by Pope Francis. As a Bishop of the Church in Peru, he served as Vice President and member of the Permanent Council of the Peruvian Bishops' Conference. In 2023, Pope Francis appointed him as Prefect of the Dicastery of Bishops and elevated him to the College of Cardinals. Pope Leo XIV holds a doctorate in canon law from the Pontifical College of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome.

Commenting on this historic moment, the President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Most Rev. William T. McGrattan, Bishop of Calgary, asks the faithful to embrace the new Pope: "I encourage the faithful in Canada to unite with their local Ordinary in welcoming Pope Leo XIV as our new Holy Father, and to remember him daily in their prayers so that he may embark on his Petrine ministry with fidelity, confident that the Lord will help him."

As the Church in Canada rejoices today with Christians throughout the world, let us remember our new Holy Father in prayer, that despite the considerable weight of his role and responsibilities, his yoke may be easy and his burden light (cf. Matthew 11:28-20). May God grant strength and wisdom to our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV, and may Mary, Mother of the Church, be ever at his side, guarding him with her mantle of protection. PARISH SPRING CLEAN UP!


Can you help out on Saturday morning? Meet in the parish parking lot at 7:30 am as we are doing a parish yard spring clean-up!



E.R.I.K. Kits Available

An Emergency Response Information Kit (**E.R.I.K**) can assist emergency responders in sittions where a patient may not be able to communicate their conditions, medical history or allergies. It provides essential information so responders can provide the correct care in an emergency medical situation.

The kit is ideal for seniors, chronically ill persons, those who live alone or have caregivers, and those living with speech or language difficulties. Once completed, the kit should be placed on your fridge door,

where emergency crews have been trained to look for it, ensuring it is readily available if needed.

PARISH PILGRIMAGE

BLESSED VELNYCHOVSKY MARTYR'S SHRINE

SATURDAY, JUNE 14

For Jubilee 2025, Pope Francis has asked that around the world, Catholic Bishops designate certain locations within their territories as Jubilee Sites.



The Bishop Velychkovsky National Martyr's Shrine has been designated as a Jubilee Site. You are invited to make a formal pilgrimage to the Shrine especially this year to partake of a special outpouring of grace and mercy.

Don't miss the opportunity to go on this short pilgrimage on **Saturday, June 14** to St. Joseph Ukrainian Catholic Church where we will visit the shrine of Bl.Bishop Vasyl Velychkovsky and tour the museum. We are departing MMOC at **9:30** am and returning at **12:30 pm.** Tickets are **\$20** and include our bus transportation, tour, and a donation to the shrine. It is sure to be a moving experience. Tickets will be available at the end of May and space is limited.

Who is Blessed Bishop Velychkovsky and why is his shrine in Winnipeg?

He may not have been born in Canada, but he was exiled and died Winnipeg, and a national shrine of Canadian martyrs is named for him. Blessed Bishop Vasyl Velychkovsky was a Ukrainian Greek Catholic bishop martyred for the faith after the Soviet Union's takeover of Ukraine during World War II.

Considered the "Father of the Underground Church" in Ukraine, Bishop Velychkovsky was imprisoned and severely tortured by the Soviets. Exiled to Canada, within a year he died of his injuries in 1973. He was beatified a martyr by Pope St. John Paul II in 2001, and his body, exhumed in 2003, was found to be incorrupt.

The Bishop Velychkovsky National Martyr's Shrine, dedicated to this great man of faith, was Canada's second shrine built to honor martyrs. (Canada's National Shrine to the Canadian Martyrs was the first.) Built in 2002 in Winnipeg, Manitoba, the Velychkovsky Shrine contains the remains of his body. It is a place where pilgrims come to pray, ask for Bl. Vasyl's intercession, and visit the shrine's museum.


