

Virtues are the doors that lead us to holiness. They are spiritual habits that strengthen our interior life and guide us toward God. The practice of virtue helps us remain on the path of righteousness and deepen our relationship with God.

The cardinal virtues serve as the foundation of moral life and are also infused into our souls by God to direct us toward Him. They are both acquired and infused. They are acquired virtues because they are developed through repeated good actions and the use of human effort, leading to a stable disposition toward moral excellence. They are also infused virtues because they are supernatural gifts given directly by God through grace. They elevate human nature and enable a person to act with God's assistance. While they can help us be more receptive to grace, they are also oriented toward eternal beatitude.

The cardinal virtues reflect God's attributes in the faculties of the human soul, guiding us to a deeper understanding of divine life and our participation in it:

- **Prudence** represents the mind of God, serving as the rational power that orders all things according to divine wisdom.
- **Fortitude** manifests God's steadfastness, representing the irascible faculty and the strength to persevere in adversity.
- **Temperance** mirrors God's inward harmony, reflecting the concupiscible part of human nature where desires are ordered and balanced.
 - **Justice** reveals God's eternal operation and God all-encompassing fairness.

EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES

Eucharistic Miracles – Surveys have indicated that up to 70% of Catholics do not believe in the True Presence of Jesus (Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity) in the Blessed Sacrament. To refute this misconception, here is another in a series of Eucharistic miracles.

The Miracle of Morrovalle, Italy— At 2:00 a.m. on April 16, 1560, the Church of St. Francis, in the Italian city of Morrovalle, was engulfed in a terrible fire. The blaze lasted 7 hours and the church was destroyed.

As the priests were picking through the rubble, removing bits of burned wood and broken pieces of marble, they were shocked to find a Host, pure white and perfectly intact in a cavity amid the ashes. The Host lay on a scorched corporal that was arranged on a badly burned piece of linen. The tabernacle in which the Host was housed had been destroyed by the fire.

Pope Pius IV ordered a thorough investigation of the apparent miracle. After a five-month investigation, he issued a papal bull stating that there was no fraud or deceit and the event was above every natural explanation. It was the judgement that this event was "indubitato miraculo" (undoubtedly miraculous).
