

Symbolism of Holy Oil

Oil is a symbol of joy and beauty, and hence of consecration, but it is also a balm (or an ointment as would now say) which relieves pain and strengthens wrestlers, making them suppler and less vulnerable. From this varied symbolism, the Church has concentrated on three types of oil, known as the "holy oils," the oil of the catechumens gives the strength of the Holy Spirit to those who are going to be baptized and become the wrestlers of God, beside Christ, against the spirit of evil; the oil of anointing is the outward sign (the substance) used in the anointing of the sick on the forehead and the palms of the handsit relieves the sick with the presence of the Holy Spirit; the holy chrism is a fragrant oil used for anointing during consecrations. After baptism, it marks the top of the head of the new son of God. During confirmation, it crosses the forehead. After an episcopal ordination, it is rubbed into the top of the new bishop's head; similarly, the hands of a new priest are anointed with it. During the dedication of churches and altars, it is spread over the crosses of consecration and all across the table of the altar. On each of these occasions, anointing with the holy chrism symbolizes the intervention of the Holy Spirit, which according to their mission or function.

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. October includes the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7). The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the Rosary. To understand this feast, we need to go back in time. In the 16th century, the Islamic Ottoman Empire presented a serious military threat to western Europe and sent a fleet of ships to attack Christian defences in southern Europe. Pope Pius V recognised the grave danger and organised a fleet called the Holy League to confront the navy of the Ottoman Turks. On October 7, 1571, the two navies engaged in a pivotal battle that would determine who controlled maritime traffic in the Mediterranean, Adriatic and Aegean seas. The fate of western Europe depended upon the success of Christians in this navy battle, which involved more than 400 warships (it was the largest naval battle in Western history for centuries). Pius V knew he needed more than just military strength to defend Christian Europe, so he asked that all the faithful pray the rosary, requesting the intercession of the Blessed Mother. At the end of the Battle of Lepanto, the Holy League was victorious and the maritime expansion of the Ottoman Empire was permanently prevented. The next year, Pius V established a feast on October 7 in honour of the Blessed Mother, originally called Our Lady of Victory. After a few centuries, the name was changed to Our Lady of the Rosary to more clearly recognise that prayer was the greatest power at work that day on the seas.

PRAYER FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY:

And let the first of you to enter heaven not cease to plead before the Divine Mercy until I, too arrive there. May the Sacred Heart bless this agreement. Amen.
