



PARISH PENANCE SERVICE

As we did last year, we will be

having a Parish Lenten Penance Service on Palm Sunday evening, March 24th, at 6:00 p.m. We will have a number of priests assisting. If you have never been, it consists of a brief prayer service followed by the opportunity for individual confessions. It doesn't matter if it has been 5 days, 5 weeks, 5 months, 5 years, or 55 years - Our Lord is calling all of us to return to Him and seek His forgiveness. As our second graders will tell us: "There is nothing to fear because God already knows." There is no better way to prepare ourselves during this Holy Season of Lent than to seek out God's forgiveness. Why not mark it on the calendar now - and make it a family activity?

SEASON OF LENT

This is a special time in the Church's year, like a forty-day retreat, when we are invited to closely examine ourselves, and to take some concrete steps to improve and become the person God calls us to be. Through the years, the Church has pointed out the usefulness of the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, and sharing our material goods as ways to achieve that goal. Let this coming Lent be a time of renewal.

LENTEN REGULATIONS There are two days when the law of fast and abstinence apply: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The law of fast applies to those individuals of the ages 18 to 59, and it means that an individual may have one meal and may take nourishment (other than meat) twice during the day sufficient to maintain strength. Taken together, these two other opportunities for nourishment should not equal another meal. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. The law of abstinence applies to those who are 14 years of age and older, and an individual is to abstain from meat on those days.


