



**Seven Sacraments:** Name them; give the sign of each and why we celebrate them

Name	Sign	Purpose
Baptism	water	Initiates person into the Church; forgives sins; become God's adopted daughter/son
Eucharist	bread/wine	Commemorates last supper; bread/wine becomes Christ's Body and Blood; spiritual food
Confirmation	Chrism (oil)	Completes initiation; ratifies decision made at Baptism; become an adult in the Church
Marriage	vows	Unites man/woman in lifelong bond as husband and wife
Holy Orders	Laying hands	Ordains men to service in the Church as deacon, priest, or Bishop
Reconciliation	Absolution	Forgives sins
Anointing of the sick	oil	Spiritual healing/forgives sin

3. Remember to keep holy the LORD'S Day.

All Saints	Nov. 1	Feast Honoring all God's Saints
Immaculate Conception	Dec. 8	Day Mary was conceived without sin
Christmas	Dec. 25	Day of Christ's Birth
