



Let us pray that each one of us might find consolation in a personal relationship with Jesus, and from his Heart, learn to have compassion on the world.













the Liturgical Calendar!

Easter is a moveable feast determined by the lunar calendar. This year Easter was April 20. 40 days after Easter is Ascension Thursday. 10 days later is Pentecost Sunday. The Easter Season lasts 50 Days, and the Greek word for fiftieth day is pentēkostē.

The Seventh Sunday of Easter, this week, is the Sunday between Ascension Thursday and Pentecost.

Pentecost has the word 'pente' in it, but it's not about the number five—it's about counting 50 days after Easter when the Holy Spirit came!"
