CONSECRATION TO THE HOLY FAMILY

To help families live out the joy of Christ, Knights of Columbus Council 12335, with the blessing of our pastor Fr. Quezada, is inviting all St Gabriel parish families to devote themselves to the ideal model of familial love set by Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In this prayer, we ask for the aid or intercession of the perfect son Jesus Christ, Mary the perfect mother, and Joseph who is a model for every father. In preparation for Consecration to the Holy Family, your family should not only decide to dedicate itself to the Holy Family's intercession but also acknowledge that the family is sacred. The decision to consecrate your family needs to be intentional and a process through which you completely surrender to God through the Holy Family. You are accepting the truth that salvation history was changed forever by a family, and that through your domestic church, you are called to live their example. There are four suggested steps which are in this week's bulletin. This weekend at all the Masses, under direction of the priest, you will have the opportunity to recite the Consecration to the Holy Family prayer as a parish family. As a reminder, the domestic church is defined as a family which is made up of an adult, an adult couple, or adults with children which means everyone is able to choose to Consecrate themselves to the Holy Family. Thank you.

Consecration to the Holy Family

How to Prepare: In preparation for a Consecration to the Holy Family, your family should not only decide to dedicate itself to the Holy Family's intercession but also acknowledge that the family is sacred. The decision to consecrate your family needs to be intentional and a process through which you completely surrender to God through the Holy Family. You are accepting the truth that salvation history was changed forever by a family, and that through your domestic church, you are called to live their example.

Four suggested steps *before* praying the Consecration to the Holy Family:

Discuss the importance of this consecration as a family and why you are doing it.

Each member of your family is strongly encouraged to go to the sacrament of reconciliation.

As a family, intentionally choose something to fast from. The fast can be for at least a week. As our physical bodies are drawn to things of the world, it is strongly encouraged that you fast from something that you would normally do or consume. Fasting helps to discipline our minds and hearts to refrain from secular activities and be more focused on God.

Prepare for the commitment you are making. Consecration to the Holy Family is not a single event. You have chosen a way of life for your family. You and your family are consciously choosing to be a beacon of light of God's love through his Church.

CONSAGRACIÓN FAMILIAR A LA SAGRADA FAMILIA

Cómo prepararse: En preparación para la Sagrada Familia, tu familia no solo debe dedicarse a la intercesión de la Sagrada Familia, sino también reconocer que la familia es sagrada. La decisión de consagrar a tu familia debe ser intencional y debe ser un proceso a través del cual se entregue completamente a Dios a través de la Sagrada Familia. Tú estás aceptando la verdad de que la historia de la salvación fue cambiada para siempre por una familia y que a través de la iglesia doméstica, estás llamado a vivir su ejemplo.

Cuatro pasos sugeridos **antes** de rezar la Consagración a la Sagrada Familia:

Discute la importancia de esta consagración como familia y por qué la estás haciendo.

Se recomienda encarecidamente a cada miembro de tu familia que asista al Sacramento de la Reconciliación.

Como familia, escojan ayunar. El ayuno puede durar al menos una semana. Dado que nuestros cuerpos físicos se sienten atraídos por las cosas del mundo, se recomienda encarecidamente que se abstengan de algo que normalmente harían o consumirían. El ayuno ayuda a disciplinar nuestras mentes y corazones para evitar actividades seculares y estar más enfocados en Dios.

Prepárense para el compromiso que están asumiendo. La consagración a la Sagrada Familia no es un evento único. Has elegido una forma de vida para tu familia. Tú y tu familia están eligiendo conscientemente ser un faro de luz del amor de Dios a través de Su Iglesia.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

**SIR 3:2-6, 12-14; PS 128: 1-5; COL 3:12-21 or COL 3:12-17;
MT 2:13-15; 19-23**

As we continue our celebration of the Christmas season, today's feast of the Holy Family invites us to reflect on the gift and calling of family life. The Church calls the family the "domestic church," the place where our faith takes root — and where the stewardship virtue of hospitality begins.

Why is hospitality vital to family life? Because our homes should be a place of love, welcome, and restoration. We can't expect to grow in prayer, service, or faith if our home atmosphere is disconnected or tense. Though no family is perfect, we must intentionally create homes where everyone feels loved and valued.

Our readings offer practical wisdom. In the Book of Sirach, we hear about the blessings that come when children respect their parents — and when adult children lovingly care for their aging parents. Respect and tenderness build a home filled with unity and peace.

St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians offers even more insight. He reminds us that each family member is "God's chosen one," and urges us to "put on" compassion, kindness, humility, and patience — even when we may not feel like it. These small, daily acts of love foster true hospitality at home, which then extends to the wider community.

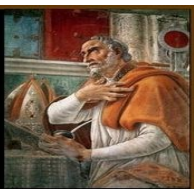
The Holy Family, too, knew hardship. As today's Gospel reminds us, they faced danger, displacement, and uncertainty. Yet Mary and Joseph remained faithful, trusting in God's plan. They are powerful intercessors for our own families today.
