GOD’S WORD TODAY
Last week’s Gospel offered us the story of the young man who asked the Lord what more he needed to do to enter eternal life. This week James and John ask the Lord not for what more they can do, but what more Jesus is going to do for them, since they are such faithful disciples. Their arrogance is quickly addressed by the Lord, who lets them know in no uncertain terms that whoever wishes to be great must become the servant of others. Once again what our society values is quite simply turned on its head by the Gospel. One of the best examples of what it means to serve is one of the titles that is used to describe the pope: “Servant of the Servants of God.” Even the one who is at the top of the hierarchy in the Church is called to be the servant of others. As we listen to today’s readings, let us pray that we will continue to be formed as true Christian servants.
