

Seek spiritual and political freedom for all

Every year at this time we are reminded, through flags, banners, and patriotic songs and events, of the blessings of the country that we are so fortunate to enjoy. Freedom has long been part of our religious and political tradition. For example, in early biblical times, the Exodus was viewed as God’s way of freeing the Hebrews from slavery in Egypt. And during the time of Christ, political freedom was often limited to citizens of Greek or Roman society. Unfortunately, only a small minority of the population enjoyed this freedom. Even when our nation was founded, this political freedom, which was so valiantly treasured, was limited to white male property owners. Although we’ve come a long way, we often still fall short in our dreams for fully realized political freedom for everyone. How can we guarantee this freedom for every one of our citizens? This is where all people who follow an almighty God come in. We all know that a loving God has created every person that is alive or has been alive. We know that every person is created in the image and likeness of that all-knowing loving God. Every person is therefore our brother or sister and deserves to be treated Seek spiritual and political freedom for all as such. Moreover, we can all experience the spiritual freedom that Christ effected for all of humanity by his passion, death and Resurrection. St. Paul, who lived in the above-mentioned Greek-Roman society, which prized earthly political freedom, tells us that the freedom granted through Christ’s saving action set us free from the bondage of sin and gave us the rights of a free state. He wrote, “our commonwealth is in heaven” (Phil 3:20) and that here on earth we are already a colony of free heavenly citizens. This freedom also extends beyond this life and refers to the Christian’s future glory that has not yet been achieved. However, Paul warns us that freedom is not license, but allows us to serve through Christ with love. He also tells us, “Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.” (2 Cor 3:17) So let us use our freedom to serve and respect one another and let us be mindful that it is the presence of the Spirit of the Lord that brings true freedom. May everyone experience true spiritual and political freedom.
