2023 Diocesan Rosary Congress

The Annual Diocesan Rosary Congress will begin on Oct. 1.

This year's congress will focus on the spiritual power of Eucharistic Adoration and the rosary.

Bishop Cahill has announced the 2023 intentions for our diocese:

1. in reparation for the sins of bishops and priests;
2. in reparation for sins against the Holy Eucharist, and for an increase and awareness of the real presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist;
3. for the gift of peace, especially in Ukraine; and
4. for an increase of vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life from our families.

Weekly Reflection ~ September 17 Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The passage from Sirach gives us a clear guide to how we should conduct our relationships. We are told to forgive injustices, refrain from nursing our anger, and treat others with mercy. These are not things that come easy to us. We want wrongs punished and we long for revenge. If we would be disciples of Christ, we must learn to forgive and be merciful with others just as we have been forgiven and granted mercy from our Lord. Consider those things that nurse your anger and your resentment and pray for the grace to let go of those feelings.
