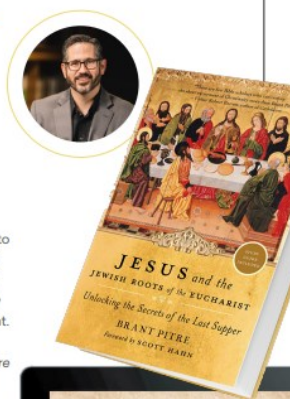

Weekly Reflection ~ February 18 First Sunday in Lent

*Once again we begin the season of Lent. We are encouraged to reflect on our lives, our sinfulness, and to make resolutions to improve ourselves in the coming year. Perhaps there is another approach we might take. Begin by reading Psalm 25 verses 4-10. Read it aloud and listen carefully. Ask the Holy Spirit to open your heart and mind to understand what the Lord wishes to teach you this Lent. Use this Psalm for your daily prayer throughout the season and discover the path the Lord will guide you on. Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me your paths.
