**Weekly Reflection ~ February 25**  
**Second Sunday in Lent**

*"If God is for us, who can be against us?" Perhaps, the better questions would be: Are we for God? It is understandable that those who see themselves as Christians, assume that God is on their side and therefore they must be in the right. The Pharisees also thought this way but they were roundly criticized by Jesus. We are not all knowing and just—that is God. We are trying to learn how to be more like God, our Father. We need to develop a humble spirit and an open heart so that we may learn how to be on God's side rather than insisting that God support our ideas and plans.*
