**Weekly Reflection ~ March 3
Third Sunday in Lent**

*We all know the Ten Commandments. It seems simple enough to follow these rules but do we really think about what they mean? Reflect on each one and consider what it means in your life. We proclaim one God, but do we create little gods—money, approval, status? Does keeping the Sabbath holy mean attending Mass or is there more to it? Are there ways we might “kill” people without inflicting mortal, physical wounds? Jesus summed up all the Commandments: Love God and love your neighbor as yourself. How well are you keeping the Commandments?
