

**The Gift of Indulgences (Nov. 1-8)**

The Month of **November** is dedicated to **the Holy Souls in Purgatory**. During this upcoming month, we are invited to remember and pray for our departed brothers and sisters.

In a special way, the Church grants the faithful an opportunity to obtain a **Plenary Indulgence** for the souls in purgatory from **November 1st through November 8th**.

If you know your Church history, you might recall that indulgences have had a bad rap since the time of Martin Luther. I'll admit, for myself, that indulgences were not something that I really went out of my way to pursue. I thought if I just tried to be good and holy in the normal way, God would sort it out in the rest. And while that is true, we have to remember the beauty of the Church founded by Christ of which we are a part of: *"I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven"* (Mt 16:19).

The Church bears the authority to bind and to loose, permitting certain graces and effects to be granted in the heavenly kingdom. This is not some kind of 'magic wand' nor is it the Church given free permission to abuse her authority over the faithful. Rather, this sacred authority exists for the good of the faithful to draw us deeper into communion with the Church and with our loving Savior.

This particular plenary indulgence, offered from Nov. 1-8, is an act of charity in which our love transcends death. We are called to assist the souls who can no longer help themselves; they, in turn, intercede for us before the Lord.

**Here is the prescription for the Plenary Indulgence for the week of Nov. 1-8:**

By **visiting a cemetery** each day between **November 1-8** and praying, even mentally, for the departed, the faithful may obtain one **plenary indulgence per day** for a soul in purgatory. The usual conditions also apply:

- Sacramental Confession** (within about 20 days before or after)
- Receive Holy Communion**
- Pray for the Intentions of the Holy Father** (*Our Father & Hail Mary*)
- Complete detachment from all sin, even venial sin** (*an act of the will*)

Take advantage of this grace-filled week! Visit a cemetery, offer a Rosary, attend Mass for the faithful departed, and commend the souls of our loved ones to God's infinite mercy.
