

Christianity Is Not Camouflage

You are meant to change the world around you. If you do not, you are useless. You are not living out your calling. A bold thing to say, I know.

Jesus didn't come here to say some nice words and do some cool things. He changed the world by his life. He stayed true to His Father, till death.

We're not here to 'have a good time', to 'live it up', or to 'do what we want'. We are here to follow Christ as he followed His father.

Christ began His mission: "Repent for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand." To follow Christ is to turn from the world. It requires being set apart from it.

If you are living your life as though your faith is in a box that you open up at your convenience, where it is just on Sunday, or with a select group of people, or in the quiet space of your bedroom, then you fail to heed Christ's message today.

Salt that has no flavor is useless. A lamp that is covered defeats its own purpose. In other words, lukewarm Christianity makes no sense. It contradicts what it is meant to be Christian.

When Jesus calls us salt and light, He is telling us that our faith must be visible. It must be bold. To be a Christian means that our choices, our words, our priorities, and even our attitudes reflect Him. It means that at home, at work, in public, and in private, we belong to the Lord. We do not switch that identity on and off.

It is a temptation for all of us to blend in and stay comfortable with ourselves and our community. But it is okay to stand out. It is okay if Christian conviction makes us different. In fact, it must. The world does not need more people who drift along with whatever is popular. It needs disciples for Christ who live with clarity, conviction, and charity.

Lukewarm is inexcusable because we have been given too much. We have received Christ Himself. We have been marked by Baptism. Everything we are and everything we have belongs to the Lord. Our time, our talents, our families, our work, our decisions—none of it is ours to keep half-heartedly.

May we all pray for the courage to have our faith strengthened and emboldened to live in a world without compromise. Salt and Light. And may everything we are and do give glory to God.
