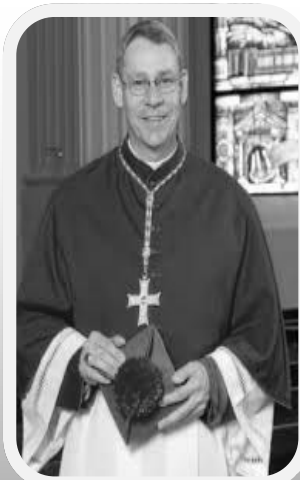

GIFT BEARERS

Gift Bearers carry our gifts of bread and wine up to the altar where they are transformed by the priest into the Body and Blood of Christ.



The Gift Bearers represent the whole congregation bringing what we have to Jesus, like the people who gave Him loaves and fishes which He transformed and fed 5,000 people (a precursor to the Eucharist).

We encourage EVERYONE to be Gifts Bearers. There is a crucifix in a holder on the small table in the back of the church. If you want to be Gift Bearers at a Mass, simply pick up that crucifix when you come in, and take it to your seat. When the ushers see that the crucifix is gone, they will know they do not need to enlist Gift Bearers. You then need to come back to that table DURING THE PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL, bringing the crucifix with you. The ushers will set you up with the vessels BEFORE they start the collection. Be ready to walk forward, and AS SOON AS FATHER COMES DOWN WITH THE SERVERS TO THE FLOOR, start walking up to him with the gifts. After he takes them from you, bow, and walk back to your seat. Thank you!

An Advent Reflection on "O Antiphons" by Fr. Kneib

A bit of history about the O Antiphons: Today the O Antiphons are most familiar to us in the hymn "O come, O come Emmanuel." Each verse of the hymn parallels one of the antiphons. The O Antiphons have been described as "a unique work of art and a special ornament of the pre-Christmas liturgy. They "create a poetry that fills the liturgy with its splendor." The antiphons are, in fact, a collage of Old Testament types of Christ. Their predominant theme is messianic, stressing the hope of the Savior's coming. The sequence progresses historically, from the beginning, before creation, to the very gates of Bethlehem.

BHI Class: Our Life in Christ

Description: This course investigates Part 3 of the *Catechism*: "Life in Christ." Students will learn the Catholic understanding of the human person, as discovered in nature and revealed by Sacred Scripture and Tradition. From the *Catechism*, we discuss the common human vocation to beatitude and how this vocation is lived out as "Life in Christ." The concepts of freedom, conscience, sin, grace, virtue, and law will be explored along with their role as the means of motivating moral action from relationship and excellence rather than mere duty and legalism. Finally, the Ten Commandments will be our frame of reference for examining specific questions about moral actions and virtues.

Cost: BHI reduced the price of tuition to only \$25 per course or \$40/married couple! Students can save even more money if they want to pre-pay for the year of courses. It is \$150/individual or \$240/married couple. As always, if a student cannot afford a course they can request a scholarship, and we will not turn them away.

APOLOGETICS CORNER: Defending Your Faith



QUESTION: What is the Immaculate Conception — Does this pertain to Jesus or to Mary?

ANSWER: *The Immaculate Conception refers to Mary being born without the stain of Original Sin. It does NOT refer to the virgin conception and birth of Jesus Christ, which many Catholics commonly misunderstand! Mary herself appeared to St. Bernadette upon asking her name she replied, "I am the Immaculate Conception. Let us join together in thanking the Most High for having preserved me from Original Sin since I am all pure, I am all good."*

It makes sense Mary would have to be perfectly sinless and pure considering how God said to His Old Testament priests "Purify yourselves you who carry the vessels of the Lord..." Is 52:11 (referring to the items inside the Ark of the Covenant which foreshadowed Jesus Christ) then how pure would Mary, the one who carried the LORD himself, have had to be?

From Letters to St. Ignatius by St. Francis Xavier, Priest & Missionary

"Many, many people hereabouts are not becoming Christian for one reason only: there is nobody to make them Christians. Again and again, I have thought of going round the universities of Europe...and everywhere crying out like a madman, riveting the attention of those with more learning than charity: 'What a tragedy: how many souls are being shut out of heaven and falling into hell, thanks to you!' I wish they would work as hard at this as they do at their books, and so settle their account with God for their learning and talents entrusted to them. This thought would certainly stir most of them to meditate on spiritual realities, to listen actively to what God is saying to them. They would forget their desires, their human affairs, and give themselves over entirely to God's will and his choice. They would cry out with all their heart: *Lord, I am here! What do you want me to do? Send me anywhere you like - even to India!*"
