





THE MONTH OF JULY IS DEDICATED TO THE PRECIOUS BLOOD.

Devotion to the Precious Blood is not a spiritual option, it is a spiritual obligation, not only for priests, but for every follower of Christ. **Come pray the Precious Blood Chaplet with us on Tuesday nights** during July for your own private intentions and those listed below. We are living in an age in which to sin has become fashionable. This veneration of the Precious Blood, which is the first element in our devotion to the Precious Blood means that we have a deep sensitivity to the awfulness of sin. Sin must be terrible.. must be awful. It must be the most dreadful thing in the universe. Why? Because it cost the living God in human form the shedding of His Blood.

The Feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood. *"The Church reminds us of the first drops of blood that flowed*"

May the Most Precious Blood that pours out from the Sacred Head of Our Lard Jesus Christ, the Temple of Divine Wisdom, Tabernacle of Divine Knowledge and Sunshine of Heaven and Earth, over us now and Govered. Amen.


for our redemption on the day when Jesus was circumcised. We see the holy face crimsoned with blood during the agony in the garden. In the scourging chamber we see the Lord... under raw strokes the divine Blood spurts out over the floor. Christ is led before Pilate. Pilate shows the blood-covered Body to the crowds: Ecce homo! The bloody footsteps to Golgotha cover the streets of Jerusalem. Down the beams of the Cross blood trickles. A soldier opens the sacred side. Water and Blood."

WHERE: At the Divine Mercy Chapel at the Catholic Radio Station next to St. Pius High School.

WHEN: 7-8PM every Tuesday night.

WHAT: The Chaplet of the Precious Blood of our Lord Jesus is said immediately after the Holy Rosary. Both last approximately 55 minutes total. Intentions are for 1) an increase in belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, 2) for evil to be dispelled from the priesthood, 3) to expel any evil from our families.

"I will allow my Precious Blood to fall on the heart of every sinner offered to my Precious Blood. I say to you offer to me and pray for them always through my Precious Blood. I will destroy all evils in your families. I have heard your prayers. Rejoice for your request has been granted."

ADULT FAITH FORMATION with Fred Hack

If you are fortunate enough to remember Star Trek, you may also remember Leonard Nimoy, a.k.a. Mr. Spock. His heritage was Jewish and he tells how that religion gave him the experience to create the Vulcan Greeting. For those who want the whole story and are not afraid of You Tube, search for Nimoy tells how he got the Vulcan greeting.

This weekend, July 24th & 25th we are having a visiting Missionary priest. His name is Fr. Deva Gudime. Here is a brief description about his missionary work and the community that he assists in. Prayerfully consider a donation to his work. Thank you.

THE DIOCESE OF CUDDAPAH: INDIA.

The Mission Diocese of Cuddapah, Andhra Pradesh, India was established in 1977. The diocese consists of two Civil Districts; Cuddapah and Chittoor. The total population is. 5,834,481. Currently, there are approximately 80,000 Catholics.

PASTORAL APOSTOLATE:

At the parish level, there are approximately one to two priests who celebrate the Holy Mass, teach catechism, and visit villages to administer sacraments and to pray with the villagers.

Many people of India live in poverty and are deprived of basic amenities including drinking water, housing, sanitation, and health care. It is a challenge to our Diocese to improve the living standards of our people. Some of the main concerns are health care, housing, women empowerment, and child development. Much of our charity goes towards the medical care of the poor. Due to the hot climate, poor living conditions, and poor nutrition, many people fall victim to Tuberculosis and other sicknesses.

The diocese also provides assistance during calamities including floods and fires.

EDUCATION ACTIVITIES:

Education plays a vital role in the Sociology- Economic development of the people. It is one of the primary concerns of the diocese. Our diocese has pioneered various schools for the poor. To promote education, boarding homes affiliated with the school have been established. Currently, these homes house 1,500 hundred children. Special consideration including scholarships geared toward job orientated courses are granted to girls in order to promote education among women.



Parkville Women's Clinic-Social Outreach Event

Y'ALL - Young Adults Loving Life is a group of young adults (under 35ish) that are ready to engage in the life ministry. This will be a networking group with a purpose. We will meet quarterly and at each gathering will have social time, educational time regarding services at Parkville Women's Clinic and a Call to Action! We firmly believe that with their engagement, we can work together to change the culture of life in our communities! Our next event will be Tuesday, July 28 at our clinic. It will include a food truck - 2 Guys and a Grill - and touring of Parkville Women's Clinic. These are casual events. Just an update - in June, we hired a part-time Fatherhood mentor to be in the clinic. Even if the young men aren't ready for a one-to-one mentorship, our mentors introduce themselves and let these fathers know their importance in the pregnancy. And starting in July, we will begin testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections (STI). Like all of our services, there will be no cost and we will test and treat both women and men!
