Dear Friends in Christ,

This week I will be away on our bi-annual priesthood convocation for the Archdiocese of Baltimore. We will be staying near Emmitsburg for three days of conference, fraternity, and prayer. The topic is about priestly happiness and how to sustain and foster it. Did you know that when studies are done about which professions find the greatest happiness and satisfaction in their work priesthood always ranks up near the top? I will be the first to admit it can be a crazy adventure to be a priest and I often feel overwhelmed. Yet somehow amid the struggles and challenges and sacrifices I find such joy in being a priest and in serving God's people! I often wonder why more young men are not encouraged to go to seminary? You get a wonderful education, a guaranteed job, and you become part of a strong fraternity of brother priests and meet some of the best friends you could ever hope for. You have an exciting job that no two days will ever be the same. The retirement benefits are "out of this world" (get it?). Yes, it is true that you will not make lots of money and that you promise to live a simple life of service even forsaking a family and children and that you must be ready to move or take on new assignments or duties whenever the Archbishop calls upon you, but there is something freeing in knowing your life is not your own.

All this being said, there is a true priestly vocation crisis in our Church. Please pray for more priests and encourage people to discern God's call through the Church to be a priest. As the shortage of priest ripples through our Church there is less availability of the Sacraments and Masses. Priests are overworked to exhaustion at times, and it becomes harder to form relationships with the clergy. This has led many good people to question if it is time to ordain married men or to discern women clergy. Thankfully, this is above my paygrade, and I am just a humble obedient servant of Mother Church. All I know is that the priesthood is a good life, a life I would love to share with many more people. I truly am so happy to be your priest. Pray for me and know that I am praying for you; and let us together pray for more priests.

St. Matthew Macaroni and Ground Meat Casserole



RECIPE:

Ib. Macaroni
Ibs. Ground Beef, Turkey, Pork or Veal
oz. Jar Spaghetti Sauce
Onion and/or Green Pepper (optional)
Shredded Cheese (optional)

DIRECTIONS:

Brown the ground meat, onion, and pepper. Cook macaroni, drain. Mix all ingredients together in an oiled casserole pan. Cover with foil, crimp edges and refrigerate or freeze.

THIS DISH NEEDS NO BAKING IN YOUR HOME.

HELPFUL HINTS:

- Casserole may be made in advance and frozen
- Spray the underside of aluminum foil with Pam, Mazola, etc. to keep from sticking to casserole when reheated. (*Please be sure the pan is completely covered with foil use large size or 2 pieces if necessary*)
- If adding cheese, mix it into casserole; do not leave on top
- If casserole looks dry, add tomato juice, canned tomatoes, or additional sauce CASSEROLE PANS ARE AVAILABLE AT CHURCH EXITS AND AT THE RECTORY
