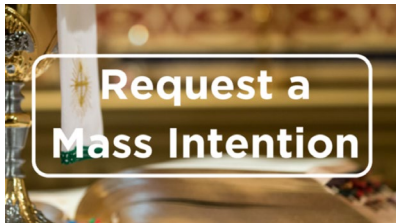

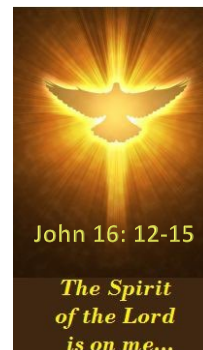

“Second Homily” by Fr. Duane Trombetta

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Sunday, June 12, 2022

Blessings to all our treasured parishioners at Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament. Today marks the annual solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Our opening prayer, or *Collect*, from the Roman Missal reads, “Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love!” Isn’t this a theologically sound and appropriate prayer for such a beautiful feast day!

Though many religions invoke God as “Father,” for us Christians, the revealed truth of God as Holy Trinity lies at the very root of our living faith – and has since the beginning. We do not confess three Gods, but rather, one God in three persons: the consubstantial Trinity. The divine persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire. What amazing and mysterious truths!

Associated with this feast day, especially for our neighbors at Holy Trinity Church in Shreveport, we venerate the Five Servant of God Priests who ministered to the sick during the 1873 Yellow Fever Epidemic. Of them, Fr. Jean Pierre served as first Pastor; Fr. Isidore Quémerais served as first Associate Pastor; and all five administered the sacraments right in downtown Shreveport. Actually, all the people of the Diocese of Shreveport remain united to the Five Priests, because the triune God to whom they prayed is the very triune God to whom we pray.

Today I close my Second Homily with another prayer from the Roman Missal: “God our Father, who by sending into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification made known to the human race your wondrous mystery, grant us, we pray, that in professing the true faith, we may acknowledge the Trinity of eternal glory and adore your Unity, powerful in majesty”!

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity – Year C

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This is the center of our faith where everything originates and where everything returns to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Three equal but yet different persons. The mystery we received at Baptism, when we were Baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. And each time we enter church before Mass we put our hand into the Holy Water font and renew our Baptismal vows by making the sign of the Cross. We could spend months or even years trying to learn about the relationship to the Trinity, but I can remember one time a person describing the Trinity in three words, that was Lover (Father), his Beloved (Son), and his Love (Holy Spirit).

When I was a child here at Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Academy, the Sisters of the Holy Ghost use to tell us a story about Saint Patrick and the shamrock. The story is told of how Saint Patrick used an example of the Irish plant the shamrock to explain the Trinity. When challenged to explain how God could be three in one, St Patrick reached down and plucked a shamrock. Holding it up, he asked, “is it one leaf or three?” the reply was, “it is both one leaf and three” to which St. Patrick responded, “And so it is with God.” Three in one. And also in his personal confession, St Patrick writes: For there is no other God, now, ever was before, nor shall be here after, but God the Father, unforgotten and without beginning, and his son Jesus Christ, who always existed with the Father before the beginning of time. And he poured out his Holy Spirit on us in abundance, which makes the believers and the obedient into sons and daughters of one God in the Trinity of holy name.

Our Father, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness. His Son his beloved that in our gospel we hear proclaimed that God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believe in him should not perish but have eternal life. Jesus died for you and you alone because he loved you. We often hear in scripture that God knew each one of us even before we were in our mother’s womb. God loves each one of us as if there were only one of us to love. Through his death, resurrection, and ascension into Heaven Jesus paved the way for us through the guidance of the Holy Spirit to join him. And this Spirit, the Father and the Son’s love given to us to help us to grow in understanding as we experience this Trinity. It is the Holy Spirit who reveals the Father and the Son to us and who gives us the gift of faith to know and understand the truth of God’s word.

The Father, the Lover, the Son, His Beloved, and the Holy Spirit, his Love; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is all laid out for us; God loved us so much that he sent his Son to die for our sins and to be the Light, the Truth and the way to salvation and eternal life with Him. And through the Spirit, Jesus provides us with a faithful guide. Prepare your hearts to receive Him, listen to Him, learn from Him. On this Sunday of the Holy Trinity, God is inviting us into the house of love to commune with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, to love and be loved, to believe and be guided into all truth and beauty and peace.

Saint of the Day for June 15 Saint Marguerite d'Youville's Story

We learn compassion from allowing our lives to be influenced by compassionate people, by seeing life from their perspectives, and reconsidering our own values.

Born in Varennes, Canada, Marie Marguerite Dufrost de Lajemmerais had to interrupt her schooling at the age of 12 to help her widowed mother. Eight years later she married François d'Youville; they had six children, four of whom died young. Despite the fact that her husband gambled, sold liquor illegally to Native Americans, and treated her indifferently, she cared for him compassionately until his death in 1730.

Even though she was caring for two small children and running a store to help pay off her husband's debts, Marguerite still helped the poor. Once her children were grown, she and several companions rescued a Quebec hospital that was in danger of failing. She called her community the Institute of the Sisters of Charity of Montreal; the people called them the "Grey Nuns" because of the color of their habits. In time, a proverb arose among the poor people of Montreal, "Go to the Grey Nuns; they never refuse to serve." In time, five other religious communities traced their roots to the Grey Nuns.

The General Hospital in Montreal became known as the Hôtel Dieu (House of God) and set a standard for medical care and Christian compassion. When the hospital was destroyed by fire in 1766, Mère Marguerite knelt in the ashes, led the *Te Deum*—a hymn to God's providence in all circumstances—and began the rebuilding process. She fought the attempts of government officials to restrain her charity, and established the first foundling home in North America.

Pope Saint John XXIII, who beatified Mère Marguerite in 1959, called her the "Mother of Universal Charity." She was canonized in 1990, and her liturgical feast is celebrated on October 16.
