Notes from Fr. Francis

Dear Parishioners,

I am excited to share an update about the special project
underway in our choir loft. As many of you know, we are
installing a new pipe organ, generously gifted to us by the
Congregation of Saint John in honor of St. Ignatius Parish's
100th anniversary. This will be a long-term endeavor, with
work officially beginning this past week.

This will be a multi-phase endeavor, with the first playable
version ready for the Installation Mass on September 10. The
final organ will include both digital "Hauptwerk" technology
and 11 ranks of pipes. In addition to the organ itself,
renovations are underway in the choir loft and organ chamber
to restore them to their original architectural glory. This marks
the start of needed restoration work on our historic church.
Safety improvements like raising the banister height are also
planned. While this long-term project will continue over
several months, we eagerly anticipate hearing the first notes of
our new instrument on September 10th.

The installation of our new organ will be a transformative
moment in the history of our church. We are blessed to be
undertaking this project made possible by the generosity and
support of the Congregation of Saint John and our
parishioners. Once completed, this exceptional new instrument
will facilitate joyful communal singing, bring talented
organists to our church for Sacred Music concerts, support our
choirs and cantors, and assist us in offering praise and prayer
through music for years to come.

While the project will take time, patience, and care, we
eagerly look forward to hearing the first notes of the organ
during the Installation Mass on September 10th. I hope you
will join us as we celebrate this milestone and the continued
progress of an initiative that will deeply enrich our worship.
Please keep those working diligently on the organ installation
in your prayers during this exciting time.
