Notes from Fr. Francis

Dear Parishioners of St. Ignatius of Loyola,

Peace and blessings to you all!

Today, I wish to delve into a beautiful and ancient tradition of our Catholic liturgy: the use of incense during the Holy Mass. Many of you have witnessed the rising smoke from the thurible, accompanied by the rhythmic sound of the chains, and perhaps wondered about its significance. Let's explore the liturgical reasons behind this sacred practice.

- 1. **Symbol of Prayer:** In the Book of Psalms, we read, "Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice" (Psalm 141:2). The rising smoke of the incense visually represents our prayers ascending to Heaven, a poignant reminder that our worship and petitions are directed to God.
- 2. A Sign of Reverence: Incense is used to venerate the altar, the Book of the Gospels, the bread and wine, the assembled congregation, and the Body and Blood of Christ at the elevation. By doing so, we acknowledge the sacredness of these elements. Just as the Magi offered incense as a gift to honor the infant Jesus, we too use it to show our reverence to the Lord.
- 3. **A Reminder of Sacrifice:** The burning of incense recalls the burnt offerings of the Old Testament, where offerings were made to God as a sign of devotion and atonement. While the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross is the ultimate atonement for our sins, the aroma of incense serves as a reminder of the sacrificial nature of the Mass.
- 4. **Symbol of Purification:** Incense has a purifying quality. Its sweet fragrance purifies the surroundings and creates an atmosphere of sanctity. This is especially significant during funerals, where incense is used to bless the deceased's body, symbolizing the prayer for the person's purification.
- 5. **Engaging the Senses:** The liturgy is designed to engage all our senses, drawing us wholly into the mystery of the Eucharist. The sight of the smoke, the sound of the chains, and the fragrance of the incense all serve to engage us more deeply, reminding us of the sacredness of the Mass.
- 6. **Connection to the Universal Church:** The use of incense is not exclusive to the Catholic Church. It has been a part of Christian worship across various traditions for centuries. When we use incense, we are connected to the universal practice of Christians throughout history and across the world.

In conclusion, the use of incense during the Mass is rich in symbolism and deeply rooted in Scripture and tradition. It serves as a bridge between Heaven and Earth, drawing us into a deeper communion with the Divine. As we witness the incense being used in our liturgy, may we be reminded of its profound significance and be inspired to offer our lives as a fragrant offering to God.

We will be using incense on the Sunday Masses at 7:30am and 10am. At 7:30am the incense will be restricted to a smaller amount used only at the altar. At 5pm on Saturday, we will not be using incense.
