ST. ANDREW AVELLION by Taylor Thelen

St. Andrew Avellion was born in 1521 in Castronuovo—a town in the southern Italian region of Basilicata. St. Andrew's birth name was Lancelotto, which he changed to Andrew. After receiving his elementary education, he was sent to Venice for a course in humanities and philosophy. Afterwards, St. Andrew traveled to Naples to study law and was then ordained a priest at the age of 26. The archbishop of Naples commissioned him to reform a convent in Naples. At the convent, he was brutally assaulted and brought to the mystery of the Theatines to heal. This is when he decided to devote the rest of his life to God. St. Andrew Avellion died on November 10, 1608 when he was stricken with apoplexy. After receiving the Holy Viaticum (the reception of the Holy Eucharist by some on their deathbed) he died at the age of 88.

His teachings had the most effect in the country of Italy, which is while he is the patron saint of Naples, Sicily, as well as stroke victims. Sixteen years after his death, he was beatified by Urban VIII, and in 1712 was canonized by Clement XI. St. Andrew Avellion was known throughout his life for his generosity and strength, as well as devoting every free moment he had to prayer and contemplation. I can be like St. Andrew by being loving towards my friends and family and being a rock for them during difficult times. Furthermore, I can devote myself to God like St. Andrew by going to church, praying daily, and bringing God into my daily life.
