
A Parish nurse is available to visit upon request whether you are in the hospital, a care center or at home. The nurse can provide support, prayer and information to help you navigate our complex health care system.



ST. BRIGID of IRELAND by Vivian Resch

St. Brigid of Ireland was born 451 in Dundalk, Ireland. She influenced not only Ireland but many other countries and regions across the world. St. Brigid is the patron saint of dairymaids, cattle, midwives, newborn babies, Ireland and Irish nuns. Her original birth name is Brigit which shares with the Celtic goddess. When her mother was pregnant with her, she was sold to a Druid landowner. When Brigid was little, she could not digest the food the Druid fed her. She had a cow (with red ears) that was her only food source. When she was ten she ventured back to her father, and she gave her father's possessions to those in need. Her father later tried to sell her to the king, but the king truly saw her heart and told her father to set her free. Brigid ventured back to her mother and the Druid. Her mother was the one who had taken care of the Druid dairy, so Brigid took over her mother's job and with her kind heart she fed the poor and healed them, continued to give milk to those in need. She refused marriage and joined the church. She founded a monastery called the Church of the Oak. She also founded a school of art.

Some of the traits she possesses that make me want to be like her is her kindness towards others. She was always willing to help those in need and that is something I want to do in my life. I can achieve this trait in many ways such as volunteering at church, donating items to the Giving Tree for the needy and being kind to others. As she is the patron saint of cattle, I also want to be able to have my own farm with beef when I am older.
