



ANSWERING LITURGICAL CONFUSION

It has been stated many times to me, as to when are we to stand and kneel and sit. A few years ago the bishop's office sent out the norms to be followed in the diocese of Sault Ste. Marie. The most confusing part was at the time of communion. Bishop Plouffe had asked that we remain standing from after the consecration to the end of communion.

When is the end of communion? It is when the last person in the communion line is finished

receiving the Eucharist. Then the assembly is to kneel or sit in prayer until the priest says "let us pray". At that point the assembly stands. The gesture we are making is that **we** are the Body of Christ not I am the Body of Christ. It is together that we act as one.
