Do You Know What Your Elementary School Student is Doing After School? Holy Family Day School has a great program limited to 20 students for after school care. Students attending John B. Dey, Trantwood, or Alanton Elementary school may ride a VBCPS bus to Holy Family. The program is structured to include playground time, snack time, homework time, centers, and other activities.





ST. NICHOLAS SPONSORED TRIP TO PHILADELPHIA FOR MASS WITH POPE

FRANCIS CANCELLED: It is with great disappointment that St. Nicholas Catholic Church had to make the decision to cancel the trip to Philadelphia in September. They learned on Friday, June 19, that the conditions of transportation set by the City of Philadelphia will not allow any buses or cars in town. All buses will be charged \$400.00 to park outside the City Center and only public transportation will be available for participants. Distances to walk from City transportation stations to the site of the Mass are going to be between one and two miles one way.

Moreover, the Mass with Pope Francis is now set to take place Sunday afternoon. It means that by the time participants to the Mass with Pope Francis manage to return to the bus parking lots, it will be too late to return the same day to Virginia Beach. These conditions would require our travel agent, "Amber Tours," to add:

- one night at a hotel
- cost of the unexpected parking fee set for buses by the City of Philadelphia
- and, finally, an extra day to return to Virginia Beach with the corresponding bus cost (3 days instead of 2 days)

Please accept our apologies and our thanks for all the efforts Holy Family did to promote the trip. We understand what it means to some of our parishioners so eager to participate in such an extraordinary event!
