DIOCESAN 2014 ANNUAL APPEAL UPDATE:

301 families pledged \$64,010.00 for \$143.88% of our goal of \$44,490.00. \$61,630.50 has been paid to date, leaving a balance of \$2,379.50.

With three rounds of funding, the Diocese has returned \$1.2 million to the parishes, which is the highest in the history of the Appeal. In 2013, Holy Family received \$13,155.38 and in 2014, Holy Family has received to date \$17,663.99.



"CARE FOR OUR EARTH:"

We may be quite diligent in engaging in practices which contribute to our Earth's well-being while at the same time unknowingly promoting the abuse She endures. Our efforts to preserve our Earth could be neutralized by what we do with our money. Whether we have a little money or a lot, where we bank and how we invest does impact our Earth. By moving our money into the RIGHT savings and investing vehicles we can ensure that it works for a greener planet. This strategy is called SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE INVESTING (SRI). Where we put our money can bolster forward-thinking companies working on sustainable solutions, help to lift up low-income communities and reduce carbon and water footprints. On the other hand, the funds we invest and bank (like mega-banks) could be supporting those corporations and industries whose practices abuse our Earth. Some strategies included in socially responsible investing would be: educate ourselves as to what our bank and investment company does with our money; place our money in a community development bank, a credit union or mutual funds whose mission is to help low-income communities and the greening of our Earth; swap our mega-bank credit card for a responsible credit card with a credit union; invest in stocks and SRI mutual funds which direct their monies to corporations and industries that care about our Earth.
