
FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

"CARE FOR OUR EARTH:"

Few of us have given any consideration to where our food comes from or the processes our food endures to reach our tables. We are for the most part ignorant and disconnected regarding the food we eat. We blindly trust that what foods are in our food stores are safe! And what we put into our bodies will result in good or not good health. We owe it to ourselves to check into this matter. One place we can start is viewing the documentary, "Food, Inc.," which can be obtained through the Library or Netflix or Hulu. Also, you can rent it through Amazon for \$3.99. This 90-minute film discloses some startling facts about our food. In recent years, there has been increasing incidences of food contaminated with Listeria, e-coli and salmonella. Also, there is growing speculation that the food we eat contributes to various long term illnesses that people are contracting. Thus far, foods are recalled ONLY AFTER a number of cases of contamination have occurred. A few horrifying facts the documentary focuses on would be: a handful or so of corporations control the food industry and they determine how our food is produced; the work force hired in the slaughter houses is low income, low paid individuals who apparently do not have the skills needed to do their job effectively and they are at risk being subjected to the diseases of the animals; PROFIT rather than consumer health, the livelihood of farmers, the safety of workers and our environment is primary. "Food, Inc." has a positive side- touching on the production of healthy food. So much more could be written but space is limited. We all would benefit greatly by taking the time to view this educational film! I'll wager that there is a lot you who do not know about the food you eat.
