"CREATION CARE CORNER"

For those of you who have been reading my articles, at least for the past 2 years, you may recall one on the topic of "E-15." E-15 is a blend of vehicle gasoline and it means that the gasoline we pump has 15% ethanol in it instead of the 10% now required by the government. For cars older than 2012 that blend can especially be very damaging, even though the EPA has approved it as safe. AAA has issued a warning regarding the use of this gasoline, which soon will be available in our local market. The damage will particularly affect the fuel system causing corrosion. The contents also will destroy gaskets. At this point, there are 10 major automobile companies who refuse to honor the repair of the damage. Others maintain that the warranty would be voided. It is believed that this blend with 15% ethanol, which is produced from corn, is an effort to increase the production of corn. Drivers will be attracted to fill up with E-15 because it is less expensive. However, it is 3 octanes lower than regular gasoline, so the car will not get as much mileage.
