"CREATION CARE CORNER"

Occasionally, the remark is made that those environmentalists who are highlighting the "cry of the Earth" are doing so to the neglect of the poor (the "cry of the people"). They, however, are not two separate cries pitted against each other; rather, they are two faces of the same living planet struggling to survive. A fair question is raised--where exactly do the poor fit into environmentalists' concern for the Earth? How can the poor be asked to take action to save rainforests and reduce climate change when they may not know where their next meal is coming from? An answer would be that in the immediacy of their present circumstances, they would not be expected to join in the actions of the environmental movement. The critical point here, however, would be that the Earth itself has become the threatened context of all our lives, as well as much of the life of the total planet.

The context of the threatened planet may be the same for all of us, but the poor certainly experience it more cruelly and unfairly. They bear the brunt of a worldview and an industrial way of life that is grossly out of sync with the ways of the Earth. But, the Earth cannot be separated from the poor; the poor cannot be separated from the Earth.

This calls for a new perception of the human as one, who is not only the creature made in the image of the Creator, but rather one whose true glory is to be integral with the rest of the Earth community. We are "Earthlings" before all else! The Earth, a single living organism, actually lives through a vast network of feedback mechanisms and interdependent systems of which humans are only a part.
