#### Jesus Teaches About the Kingdom of God

This session focuses on the teachings of Jesus as He, "set his face to go to Jerusalem." He departs Galilee to fulfill the mission for which God sent Him into the world and to accomplish His "exodus" in Jerusalem. In addition to the twelve apostles, many others followed Jesus and He made it clear to them what it would cost to be His follower. Jesus knew that His time was short and that He must prepare His disciples for His departure. So He appointed seventy-two and sent them out in pairs ahead of Him to the towns and places He was to visit. They were given the authority to announce the coming Kingdom of God to all who would listen, to heal the sick and to cast out evil spirits.

Jesus used this time to teach His disciples, usually through parables, what the Kingdom of God is like, He taught them how to pray and to order their prayers in a way that directs them towards God. He trained them to carry on after He was gone by giving them the authority to rule in His place. He appointed the twelve apostles to lead the twelve tribes of Israel, thus reconstructing the kingdom around Himself. It is during this time that Simon confesses Jesus as the "Christ, the Son of the living God" and Jesus gives him a new name, Peter, the "rock" upon which He will build His church and proceeds to give Peter the keys to the kingdom. In doing so, we understand that the Church is Christ's Kingdom and that Peter and his successors will have the job of ruling the Church on earth. As the disciples draw closer to Jerusalem, Jesus begins to prepare them for the fact that His throne will not be on earth but heaven, a concept they could not comprehend.

#### "CREATION CARE CORNER:"

Our Earth is much more than just a place where we live.

Fr. Richard Rohr broadens our understanding of the Earth in his February 13, 2018, Daily Meditation. He writes "God always and forever comes as one who is totally hidden and yet perfectly revealed in the same moment or event." He goes on to explain that "The first act of Divine Revelation is creation itself. Nature is the first Bible written approximately 14 billion years before the Bible of words." St. Paul affirms in Romans 1:20 that "God initially speaks through creation ... for what can be known about God is plain... because God has made it plain... Ever since the creation of the world, God's invisible nature, namely, God's eternal power and deity, have been there for the mind to see in the things that God has made." Fr. Rohr states that "Heaven and Earth, divinity and humanity have never been separate; though we think so."

The point is clear that our Earth and all its creatures, in some way, represent God and speak to us (who listen) about who God is. It seems to follow, then, that when we honor, respect, and are thankful for the Earth, we are honoring, respecting, and being thankful for God's revelation of Himself.




