

“CREATION CARE CORNER:”

Chesapeake Bay Bivalves

Bivalves in the Chesapeake Bay are sea creatures consisting of two shells joined together by a hinge. There are four classes of such creatures in the bay that are important to the environment and to the sea food industry. They are oysters, clams, mussels, and scallops.

Oysters are the most important at this time because they have an established market as food and are well known for their enormous capacity to filter the water of the Bay. One oyster is supposed to be capable of filtering 50 gallons of water a day.

The next in line of importance is probably the clam because it also has an established market as food and it, too, can filter a lot of water. One clam is supposed to be able to filter 25 gallons of water a day.

The next two, the ribbed mussels and the Bay scallop are, at this time, probably of about equal importance. They both can be eaten. Recently there has been established a program to increase the population of the Bay scallop because the habitat for them has improved, and a good commercial market for them as food may be possible. (See article in the October issue of *“Coastal Living,”* pp 64-67)

Mussels are also good eating, but you should only harvest them at high tide as they close up at low tide and keep their waste inside them. Their filtering capacity is only about one gallon of water a day, so they are no match for the oyster and the clam in their effect in filtering the water.

You can help improve the environment by supporting programs aimed at increasing the population of these four bivalves. Eating more of them to increase their population may be counter intuitive, but because today we have harvesters who grow them rather than just harvest them from the wild, they grow more of them to satisfy their customers.

Catholic Hymnals & Care of the Earth



In the spirit of St. Francis, the teachings of the Church on Caring for Creation, and cost efficiency for hymnals used in our worship, Church of the Holy Family is discontinuing its subscription to disposable hymnals and purchasing the latest edition of the permanent, hardbound "Gather Hymnal," expected to be used 8-10 years.

CONSIDER THE ADVANTAGE of PERMANENT HYMNALS -

COST EFFICIENCY: 10 years of disposable hymnals will cost the parish about \$35,000, including shipping fees of almost \$500 each year. Purchasing "Gather, 3rd Edition" cost about \$14,000 including shipping for 10 years anticipated usage.

NO FUND RAISING NOR DONATIONS NEEDED: "Gather" was purchased with fiscal year 2017-2018 funds, including profits from the concert by Emmet Cahill, Irish tenor.

CONSUMPTION OF NATURAL RESOURCES: On average, printing 500 permanent hymnals will consume about six trees. Over the course of 10 years, a disposable subscription service of the same size can consume up to 45 trees – that's nearly eight times the number of trees used to make a permanent hymnal.

CARBON EMISSIONS: One permanent hymnal shipment versus repeated years of disposable hymnal shipments can mean the difference between hundreds or thousands of pounds of CO₂ being emitted into the atmosphere. The Transportation Industry is responsible for 29% of the total U.S. greenhouse gas emissions. – World Resources Institute

LANDFILL WASTE: Disposable hymnals and their packing materials contribute to landfill. Despite recycling efforts, paper makes up approximately 38.1% of landfill waste. While paper may be biodegradable, because of the lack of oxygen underground it takes longer to break down in a landfill, and coated papers (like the covers of those disposable worship aids) can take even longer.


GREENHOUSE GASES: Paper is produced from living trees. When organic matter decays, it produces methane. Methane is a greenhouse gas. The EPA maintains that methane is 20 times worse than carbon dioxide and is a significant contribution to global warming. The glue in the spine and the laminate on the cover can make recycling disposable worship aids difficult. "Cutting our paper consumption by just 10% would prevent the emission of 1.6 million tons of greenhouse gases – the equivalent of taking 80,000 cars off the road." – The State of the Paper Industry by the Environmental Paper Network
