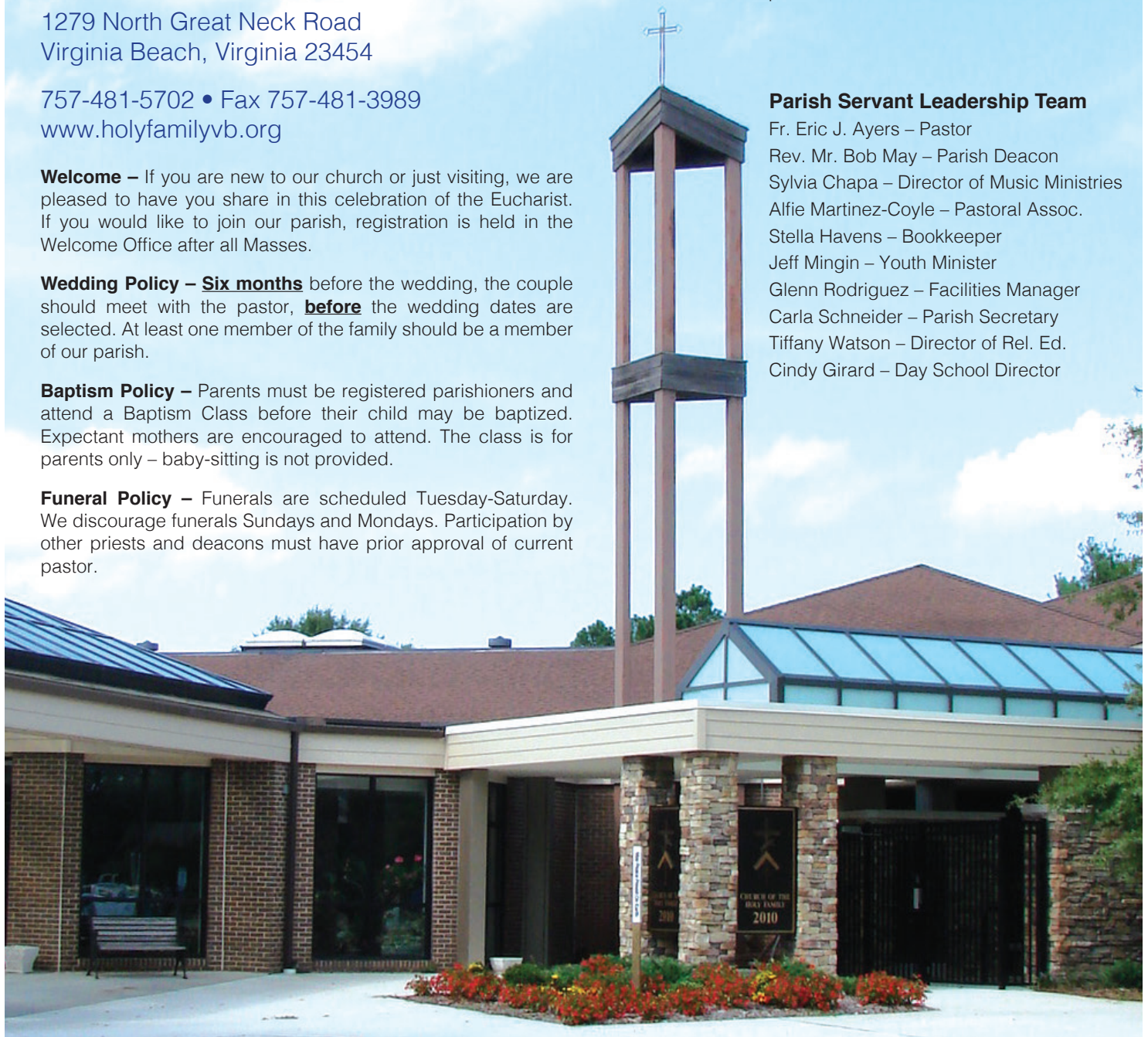

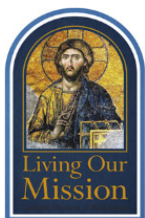

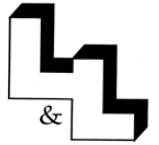

HOLY FAMILY'S CRIMINAL JUSTICE ADVOCACY MINISTRY

Donation of Christmas Cards:

Your Prison Ministry Committee, formed about two years ago, has been visiting St. Bride's Prison in Chesapeake for a few months. It seems to take forever to get clearance. We visit on Tuesday evenings following an already established schedule: On the first, second, and fifth Tuesdays we go with St. Stephen Martyr Parish and on the third and fourth Tuesdays we go with St. Gregory the Great Parish. For many reasons, we are unable to go every Tuesday, but attend when we can.

The coordinator at St. Bride's told us that every year at Christmas time they try to give each inmate two Christmas cards to send. This year the total is 2,400 cards. We have consented to do what we can to help St. Stephen Martyr with this endeavor. It doesn't mean that you have to donate a box of cards (but you can, if you wish). It was suggested that you may have two or three cards left from last year to donate. There will be a container in the Commons or Family Room clearly marked for your donations. Deadline is Sunday, November 18. Thank you in advance.

ONLINE GIVING: Online Giving is available for your Tithes and for your donations to the Capital Fund. You may make your donation through your bank account, Master Card, or Visa card. This service is not available for American Express or Discover credit cards.

You can sign up on Holy Family's website. There are also forms in the Front Office and in the Commons which you can complete for processing.

ADVOCATE'S CORNER:

October was awareness month for several things, one of which is Down Syndrome. Down Syndrome is a genetic disorder where a person has 3 copies of chromosome 21 instead of 2. Sometimes this is called Trisomy 21. The cause of Down Syndrome is unknown. It has nothing to do with race, nationality, socioeconomic status, religion, or anything the mother or father did during pregnancy. It is estimated by the CDC in 2011 that the frequency of Down Syndrome is 1 in 691 live births. It seems even in this day and time, we do not have good techniques to estimate how many people with Down Syndrome live in the USA. However, there are estimates that the worldwide population of people with Down Syndrome is around 6 million. More research is needed to know if this number is accurate. As recently as 1983, the average lifespan of a person with Down Syndrome was only 25 years. Now it is estimated they will live until they are 60 years old. It is believed that this is due to the end of institutionalizing our friends with Down Syndrome. Persons with Down Syndrome have physical and cognitive delays from birth. There is a wide range of abilities in this population. Our friends who experience Down Syndrome are actors, have fulltime jobs, start their own businesses, and are successful, contributing members of our church and our community. "CREATION CARE CORNER:"

Water, fire, earth, and air were believed to be essential elements in life. All are interconnected and one species' survival depends on the well being of the other's. A photographer, James Balog, with *National Geographic*, noticing how humans are modifying nature, produced a documentary which suggests that in our time there is a 5th element, i.e. the human element. We are a force of nature like water, air, fire, and earth. What we use and do in nature impacts us and all of the universe. In the past 10 to 15 years, there has been untold havoc occurring in nature fostered not solely by the elements of water, fire, earth, and air.

Balog had cameras film the glaciers in the Arctic for a year. The results were footage showing glaciers melting and their waters gushing into the ocean. Sea level rise will eventually affect 1.8 million people. The effects will be different around the world as well as in time for children now, who will be in their 70's and 80's years from now.

Balog sent balloons with cameras into the atmosphere to record the gases which affect the air we breathe. Atmospheric gases include carbon, methane, ethanol, VOC's, and others. He shows that since 1970 there has been an increase of 1,000% of fires burning 50,000 to 100,000 acres. High temperatures, resulting from climate change, are conducive conditions for fires. These gases are multiplied by humans emissions through farming, transportation, garbage, household products, etc. Everyone on the globe breathes the only air we have.

We are a force of nature, a 5th element. Renewable energy is on the increase with 360,000 employed! Humans are working to make a different impact on nature and the universe. We need to contribute to our healthy environment. People's life styles are a major factor in accomplishing this goal. How we live as the 5th element, how we use the resources available to us...how we are aware of our effects on the environment...how we choose the corporations we support with our investments... All of these actions have an impact on transforming our earth, so all species will survive and prosper.
