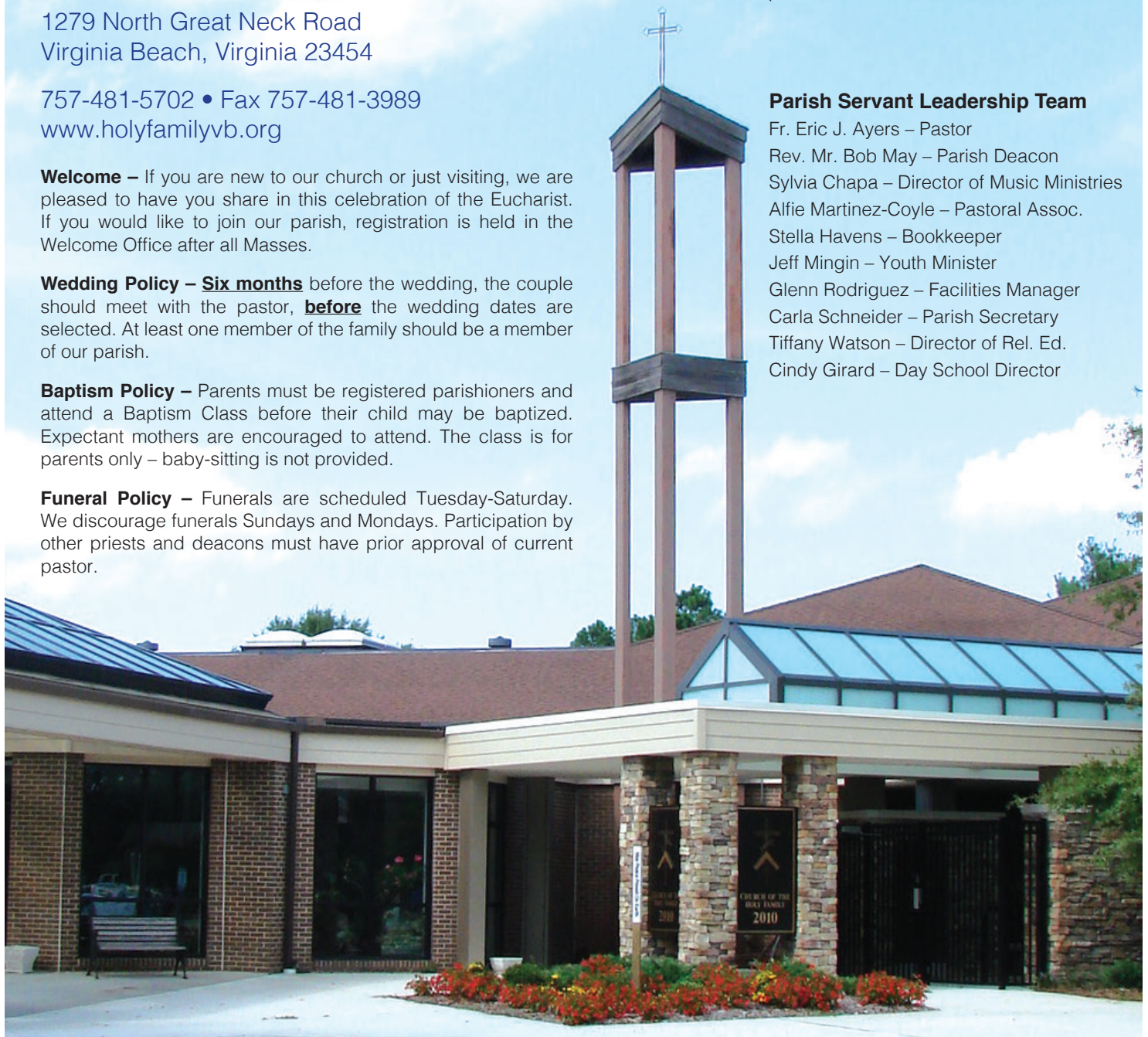

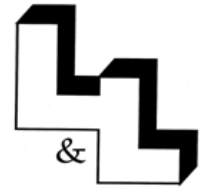

WEEKLY WISDOM



Psalms: The School of Prayer

Session Nine: The Penitential Psalms

Sometimes we feel far from God because of circumstances. Other times, however, we feel far from God because we have sinned. Sin turns us away from God. It lures us from the path of blessing and puts us on the road that leads to separation from Him.

God offers a remedy. Consider the lives of two kings of Israel - King Saul and King David. Both kings sinned. Saul lost the kingdom for his sin. David suffered consequences but his kingdom was established forever. The difference between them is not in the kind or degree of their sins but in what they did after they sinned. Saul justified his actions and shifted the blame. David fell to his knees and sought God's mercy.

One of the greatest treasures of the book of Psalms is David's prayers for forgiveness. They show that our appeal does not rest on the strength of our case but on who God is, on His promises, and His loving kindness.

When sin separates us from God, how do we get back on track? We can learn a lot from these Psalms of David.

KOVAR IS COMING!!!

WHAT IS KOVAR?

In 1971, the Knights of Columbus in the Commonwealth of Virginia sought a means to accomplish the charitable goals of the Order throughout Virginia. The result was the formation of a 501(c)(3) corporation dedicated to providing financial support to organizations which support fellow Virginians with intellectual disabilities, regardless of race, creed or ethnic background. This organization was chartered as KOVAR.

In 2018, KOVAR awarded 37 grants for a total of over \$600,000. Additionally, all \$1,800,000 in the Home Loan Fund will soon be outstanding in the form of 19 interest-free loans to non-profit group home operators. Organizations that have benefitted from KOVAR include Sugar Plum Bakery, Marian Homes, Lutheran Family Services, St. Mark Catholic Schools, Little Sisters of St. Francis, Special Olympics Virginia, Holiday House of Portsmouth, Young Life of Williamsburg, group homes, many local ARCs and Down Syndrome Association of Greater Richmond.

WHAT DOES KOVAR DO?

KOVAR collects donations through the volunteer efforts of the members and families of the Knights of Columbus and distributes the funds collected in the form of grants and loans to tax-exempt organizations that serve people with intellectual disabilities in Virginia.

HOW ARE GRANT FUNDS USED?

Grant funds are used to purchase scholarships for Special Olympics athletes, to purchase furniture for group homes, to renovate group homes, to purchase wheelchair accessible vans, and to provide job training opportunities; among other things.

"CREATION CARE CORNER"

Most of us take for granted that insect, animal, and plant species we rely upon daily will always be around. Not so! In fact, if we continue to burn carbon, stripmine the soil, and raze forests, we are headed towards the Sixth Mass Extinction. Scientists estimate that we are losing species 1,000 to 10,000 times more than the previous rate of 1 to 5 species per year. Ninety-nine percent of threatened species are at risk from human activities. Every species' extinction potentially leads to the extinction of others bound to that species. It is dangerous to separate an entire group of organisms apart from all others, ignoring their impact on the broader economy of nature. Everything is intertwined. Among all life's creatures, insects are some of the most vital.

Consider just one of the myriad ways in which insects support our survival. Of the nearly 300,000 species of flowering plants, around 90% rely on animal pollinators. Of the 200,000 species that supply this critical service, 199,000 are insects. As insects disappear, plants diminish. Plants for food, trees for building, resources for pharmaceuticals and natural products, which provide many other materials, will be insufficient for our needs. Ultimately, our survival is threatened. The insect, plant, and animal species are not inextinguishable.

When ants, mosquitoes, aphids, spiders, insects of all kinds come into your home or yard, what measures do you use to minimize or get rid of them? One strategy does not work for all. We have the job of ensuring that they are protected and that their habitats are restored and preserved in order to maintain balance in the environment.

Check into Earth Day Network (email-reply@earthday.org), to take the pesticide pledge, which will reduce the amount of pesticides that are killing insects like pollinators. Other ways you can protect the insects are also provided. And Garden Centers sell organic fertilizers and pesticides that are not harmful to insects.
