

CREATION CARE CORNER

What Can We Say About Plastic?

The best thing we can say about plastic is **it's nearly indestructible!** The worst thing we can say about plastic is **it's nearly indestructible!**

What's the problem? Think of a forgotten banana in the back of your fridge that has sat there for too long. It's mushy, brown, and beginning to smell. This is the response to decomposition caused by microorganisms. However, there aren't any organisms that have evolved to decompose plastic, hence plastic will not biodegrade. Even though it will break into ever smaller pieces, it will still exist at the microscopic level. Today, microscopic plastic is in what we eat and drink, even the air we breathe. The long-term health effects of microplastics are unknown!

Dr. Jenna Jambeck, an internationally known expert of plastics in the environment, estimates that there is an equivalent of 5 grocery bags of plastic trash sitting on every foot of coastline around the world! This waste flows into the oceans every year from coastal regions. Once in the water it is not only expensive to remove, but almost impossible. There are islands of plastic in both the Atlantic and Pacific oceans composed primarily of "single purpose plastics" such as plastic tableware, styrofoam food containers, and packaging material. There is one in the Caribbean that is moving our way. See for yourself at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PFzYnLI9xxw.

Recycle you say! After decades of earnest public-information campaigns, Americans are finally recycling. For decades, we were sending the bulk of our recycling to China – tons and tons of it, sent over on ships to be made into new plastic products, or just burned, which polluted China's air, water, and farmlands. BUT last year, China restricted imports of certain recyclables, including mixed paper – magazines, office paper, junk mail – and most plastics! Now it's our problem!

The best way to fix recycling is probably by persuading people to buy less stuff. Live below your means! But that's a hard sell in the United States, where consumer spending accounts for 68% of the GDP. The strong economy means more people have more spending money.

We were made stewards of the environment by God at Creation. Jesus commanded us to care for one another and for God's creation and to do so for God's glory. Therefore, as a faithful Catholic community, we must respond positively to our Lord's admonition to care for Creation.

Recognize that our old habit of **buy-use-throw away** that contributes to this crisis has to be replaced with **reuse and repurpose plastics** to reduce plastic waste. Secondly, and more important, we must **reduce the demand for plastics**. For example, use waxed paper to wrap leftovers. When you go out to eat, take your own "leftovers" containers with you. When shopping DO NOT grab those flimsy veggie and fruit bags. They are among the worst offenders. Instead, use mesh bags that you may have from sacks of fruit and potatoes — or buy mesh bags. For you creative people, get out the knitting needles and make bags for yourself and friends. Remember macrame?

Inside the walls of the Vatican, the head of the Vatican's garden and cleaning services said the problem of plastic is so real that the Vatican has limited its sale of single-use plastics, which include bags, water bottles, cutlery, straws, and balloons. www.vaticannews.va/en/vatican-city/news/2019-07/vatican-city-ecology-sorting-waste-plastic-environment-tornini.html.

Surely the people of the **Church of the Holy Family** should consider a similar change in behaviors and eliminate single use plastics here at church and at home.

May Our Lady, Mary, Guardian of ecological balance on the earth and of all Creation, smile down upon you.


