RETURN YOUR PALM BRANCHES TO HOLY FAMILY:

What do you do with the dried-out palms from last year that are tucked behind a crucifix or other religious picture that you are not sure what to do with? Whatever you do, don't throw them away!

According to the Code of Canon Law, blessed items are to be treated with respect and reverence and not discarded in the trash. At Mass these palm branches were blessed by a priest and became a "sacramental," which is an object that is meant to draw us closer to God. These sacred signs bear a resemblance to the sacraments (cf.#1171). Throwing them in the trash overlooks their sacred purpose and treats them like any other object we no longer need.

Bring your palm branches to Mass with you or drop them off at the Parish Office and we will burn them to use for ashes on Ash Wednesday.

END VIRGINIA'S DEATH PENALTY:

Please act on this issue as soon as you can! In 2021, we can end Virginia's death penalty with your help. Please contact your state senator, Jen Kiggans or Bill DeSteph, and ask that she/he will support Senate Bill 1165, ending Virginia's use of capital punishment. For more information on the issue and the legislation, contact Virginians for Alternatives to the Death Penalty at www.vadp.org/202-alert-senate-DP-abolition-bills.

ADORATION:

Starting Tuesday, February 2, and every Tuesday thereafter, Holy Family Church will have Adoration following the 9:30 a.m. Mass. Exposition will start immediately after Mass and Adoration will conclude at 6:00 p.m. with Benediction, followed by the 6:30 p.m. Mass.

We need at least 16 parishioners (two per hour) to sign up for each hour from 10:00 a.m. until the 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. hour. This will be your slot. If for any reason you cannot be available, please call a sub or Maureen Sinn at 757-769-7083.

All parishioners are encouraged to spend time in Adoration, for a few minutes or as long as your schedule permits. The purpose of the Holy Hour is to encourage a deep personal encounter with Christ. As Bishop Sheen said, "We are transfigured into His likeness from splendor to splendor, we become that which we gaze upon."

"RIGHT TO LIFE"



40 Days for Life is an internationally coordinated **40-day campaign that aims to end abortion** locally through prayer and fasting, community outreach, and a peaceful all-day vigil in front of abortion businesses.

The campaign is a 40-day time frame in which people in local communities pledge to pray and fast for an end to abortion. They also commit to a 40-day prayer vigil outside an abortion center or Planned Parenthood facility (Planned Parenthood does not perform abortions at all of its locations, but it refers women to its abortion centers and is the largest abortion business in the United States). In many cases, those vigils are conducted 24 hours a day.

What is unique about the 40 Days for Life Message? It encourages a positive, prayerful presence outside abortion facilities to show God's love and mercy to those who visit and work at the abortion centers. This approach avoids shouting, confrontation with patients and employees, and the use of graphic abortion images. This is the approach that has led to embrace our own prayer, fasting, and spiritual discernment. https://www.40daysforlife.com/.



THE DEATH PENALTY: A PRO-LIFE ISSUE

The VA General Assembly meets this year for only 30 days beginning Wednesday, January 13, and ending approximately February 11, unless a resolution is extended. On January 13, 2021, Virginia House of Delegates member Mike Mullin and State Senator Scott Surovell introduced bills to their respective houses that would abolish the death penalty and convert existing capital sentences of life in prison without parole.

Please email or call your state representative to support the Mullin and Surovell bill.

RECENT EXECUTIONS

- Since 1977 Virginia executed 108 death row inmates
- The last execution in Virginia was in 2017
- No Federal execution took place from 1964-2000.
- On July 25, 2019, William Barr ordered resumption of Federal executions for the first time since 2003. Since then 12 Federal executions have taken place

AS CATHOLICS WERE DO WE STAND?

- In 1995, Pope John Paul II expressed in his encyclical "Evangelium Vitae," "There can be no stepping back from the position that the death penalty is inadmissible."
- In 1999, Pope John Paul II called for abolition of the death penalty.
- In 2011, Pope Benedict XVI supported this position.
- In 2018, Pope Francis ordered a change in the Catechism to read "The death is inadmissible."
- On October 3, 2020, Pope Francis laid the words of his encyclical at the tomb of St. Francis of Assisi. Ratifying a change in church teaching on the Death Penalty.

As Catholics we must be mindful that the basic human right to life should ask us to address the death penalty. At this time there are 2 death row inmates in Virginia.

The Holy Family Prison Ministry meets via Zoom every third Tuesday of the Month at 7:00 p.m.


