"CREATION CARE CORNER":

A citizen's guide to reducing home energy waste recommends that the fastest, easiest, and cheapest way to shift towards a 100% renewable energy is first to reduce the total amount of energy we now use and waste by implementing these following steps:

- Make sure spaces such as basements, attics, and chimneys are well insulated. Insulation helps reduce the amount of energy required to maintain a comfortable temperature. The cost of insulating will be an investment for future savings.
- Caulking and weather stripping windows and doors are simple and effective sealing techniques to prevent air from escaping your home.
- Unplug chargers when they aren't in use. Chargers continue to draw energy even when they aren't connected to devices.
- Change lightbulbs to LEDs. LEDs use up to 15% less energy and last an average of 15,000 hours longer than CFLs.
- When washing clothes, consider cold washes. A washing machine spends 90% of its energy to heat water. Consider line drying if allowed by neighborhood regulations.
- When washing dishes in the dishwasher, skip heated dry and simply open the door at the end of washing to let dishes air dry.
- The average microwave uses more power displaying time in a year than it does heating food. Unplug the microwave when you are done using it or turn down its brightness setting.
- Fully power down your electronics when you are done using them. In a year, TVs, cable boxes, and video game consoles use more energy in stand-by mode than they do in active use.
- Increase energy savings by adjusting your thermostat, turning it to 78 degrees during the summer and 68 degrees in the winter.
- If possible, not driving your car just 2 days a week can reduce greenhouse gas emissions by an average of 2 tons per year.
- In most households, change the water heater temperature to 120 degrees, which is sufficient to heat water. In a typical U.S. home, 46% of energy used goes towards heating and cooling.




