

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

We have been misled by the fossil fuel industry. They want us to believe that the manufacturing of plastic products does not impact climate change or the pollution of the earth. They offer the solution of recycling, but most plastic products are not amenable to this process.

According to a Greenpeace comprehensive survey of plastics recyclability, published July 15, 2022, we were sold a whopper bill of goods in the 1970s. Most plastic items usually end up in landfills or incinerators, if not polluting the environment. The lie that recycling is a REAL solution for the explosion of plastic packaging is clear!

As people's "awareness of climate change grew," according to David Klepper, "fossil fuel companies poured millions of dollars into public relations campaigns denouncing the accumulating evidence . . ."

Greenpeace maintains that over 90% of plastic is not recycled, and that that rhetoric was an industry smokescreen to pump out more and more plastics for profit. Recycling is not – and has never been – a real solution for plastics. Our environment, oceans, and communities are paying the devastating price for this crisis. Greenpeace proposes that companies move away from single use plastics completely. Our future depends on the implementation of sustainable refill and reuse systems on a global scale. In this way, the economy will use less fossil fuels to support the way of life we have become accustomed to.

An action we can take is sign and return the Petition in Support of the Break Free from Pastic Pollution Act (S.984), sponsored by Senator Jeff Merkley. Google: Action Network, petition supporting Break Free from Plastic Pollution Act and scroll down to: Tell Congress Support . . .

This federal legislation, when passed, would protect our communities and wildlife to create a healthier, more equitable future by:

- Shifting responsibility for waste management and recycling to manufacturers and producers
- Setting up a national beverage container refund program
- Establishing minimum recycled content standards
- Phasing out certain single-use plastic products
- Prohibiting plastic waste from being exported to developing countries
- Placing a moratorium on new and expanded plastic facilities until vital environment and health regulations are updated and


The Holy Family Environmental Ministry would like to thank all the parishioners for their support. Keep collecting those plastic bags.


