
CHRIST-CENTERED YOGA

Welcome to a fairly new column that is going to help prepare us as we look forward in faith – to returning to our beautiful Worship Space. Why do we do the things we do in the Church, in the Mass? Do you have a question? Please email Laurie Powers at pal@holyfamilyvb.org and you might see the answer to your question here in the bulletin.

Church: Reverence for and in God's House

Ouestion:

How can I explain to someone that the Church is a sacred place and one must have respect?

Answer:

Explain in humble charity that a church is sacred space because offered there on a daily basis is the holy <u>Sacrifice of the Mass</u>, which is "the source and the summit of the Christian life," because in it we participate anew in offering sacramentally Christ's one redemptive Sacrifice of Calvary! (CCC 1324).

In addition, Jesus' <u>Real Presence</u> in the Blessed Sacrament remains in Church Tabernacles 24/7, which is another reason to have proper reverence while inside of a Church. The tabernacle in Church is so named because it is a place where Christ dwells in the Eucharist. Church tabernacles are located in sanctuaries, often behind altar rails. When we enter the Worship Space, we draw nearer to Christ's presence.

It is good to be mindful about correcting people in Church if they are talking before or after Mass. The Church encourages a reverent silence in preparation for Mass, but some brief conversations may take place for one reason or another.

If one feels called to have a lengthy conversation, it is more appropriate to utilize another room in the Church. Church of the Holy Family has a wonderful Family Room in which to hold conversations or socialize. We also encourage families to keep their conversations in lower tones out of respect for those who might remain afterward to pray.

On Tuesday September 13th, The Virginia Interfaith Power & Light (VIPL) hosted a "Climate Revival." The theme of the evening was "It's Time to Act." The event took place simultaneously across the state in Bristol, Roanoke, Richmond, and Hampton. The Church of the Immaculate Conception

Catholic Church hosted the event in Hampton. Climate scientists have made it clear the urgency to act on climate change.

IFTJ KEYNOTE SPEAKER HIGHLIGHT

Bill Mckibben: Author, Educator, Activist, founder of Third Act and 350.org campaign. Third Act organizes people over the age of



60 to work on climate and racial justice. He also founded 350.org.

Before the 18th century, when humans in the industrial west began to burn coal, oil, and gas, our atmosphere typically contained about 280 parts



per million on carbon dioxide. Those are the conditions "on which civilization developed and to which life on earth is adapted" Now, as the use of fossil fuels spreads through the world, the amount of the greenhouse gas carbon dioxide is skyrocketing-we're now well over 415 parts per million of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere. The goal of 350.org is to reduce carbon dioxide levels to at least 350 parts per million.

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

For Catholics, October 4 is widely recognized as the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. Francis is also known as the Patron Saint of Ecology. He was born in a small Italian town, Assisi, sometime between 1181 and 1182, and died in October, 1226. He was known for his love of all creation, but also for his dedication to the poor, peace, and interreligious dialogue, such as his encounter with the sultan of Egypt during the Fifth Crusade. It was on November 29, 1979, that Pope Paul II issued a papal bull that declared St. Francis of Assisi the patron of ecology and those who promote ecology. In the bull, Pope John Paul II wrote, "Among the holy and admirable men who have revered nature as a wonderful gift of God to the human race, St. Francis deserves special consideration." Being named the Patron Saint of Ecology at the end of the 1970's, it was the same decade that witnessed the birth of the modern environmental movement and began with the celebration of the first Earth Day, held in the USA.

In Catholic tradition, a patron saint is someone believed to have the ability to intercede with God on behalf of someone's prayers. They are also titles that honor the life that saint lived. In his "The Canticle of the Creatures," which the saint composed near the end of his life, Francis not only offers up praise of God for all of creation, but invites each creature to join him in praising God. The canticle isn't just a hymn of praise, but a reflection of how he encountered God in all things.

Franciscan Sister Ilia Delio wrote that "for Francis all creation became a theophany, a manifestation of the goodness of God, for the Canticle discloses Francis' view of nature as a sacramental expression of God's generous love." She adds that for Francis, respect for creation sprang not from an obligation, but from love, because he saw it as "intimately united with God. Everything spoke to Francis of the infinite love of God."

Franciscan Father Daniel Horan said that "St. Francis called all creatures – and not merely those nonhuman animals we classify as sentient, but rocks and trees alike – his sisters and brothers because in a real sense, they are, adding that the consequences of humanity's hubris, which sets us above creation, are visible in the pollution of the Earth, extinction of species, and climate change."

In Laudato Si', Pope Francis wrote, "the poverty and austerity of St. Francis were no veneer of asceticism, but something much more radical: a refusal to turn reality into an object simply to be used and controlled." The pope goes on to say that "Francis shows us just how inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace."

According to Sister Ilia Delio, a theologian at Villanova University, it took Francis his lifetime to develop his vision on creation. We can honor St. Francis and celebrate his life by striving for such a goal ourselves – with God's help!






