"CREATION CARE CORNER"

It is always a plus to know what is "coming down the road," especially when it is something positive! This is the case with the Global Plastics Treaty!

According to Pew and SystemIQ, plastic flows into the ocean are expected to triple by 2040. Immediate action, though, could stem the tide by more than 80%. That is why when nearly 200 countries, in March, agreed to work toward a treaty to end the plastic crisis, hope and cheers erupted. The realization that there is a long way to go and likely a lot of compromises to be made did temper the enthusiasm. Fortunately, for all of us waiting, the International Negotiating Committee (INC) meetings have started. First, we must acknowledge how amazing it is that we are at this point. It was monumental that the decision in Nairobi to start the treaty process was unanimous. Even more amazing is that they chose the aggressive starting point, focusing on the whole lifecycle of plastics rather than just waste management. There are two major reasons member states didn't settle for less. According to Erin Simon of World Wildlife Fund, "Countries already have broad alignment on the severity of the issue and the risk of both inaction and delayed response. Secondly, members of the business community came out in favor of the more aggressive approach."

The first couple of INC meetings will focus largely on nation states' starting points and the process and procedures that will be used to narrow in on a specific agreement. An important part of the process are stakeholders. What is also promising is that a multi-stakeholder forum held the day before INC-1, drew more than 1,000 individuals. One possible outcome could be from the cohort of stakeholders from 40 countries, who are focused on global measures. They favor a coordinated effort across the world that could affect global chains and policies. Global measures can also help the largest companies focus their efforts across countries and regions for the best outcomes. As the INC meetings move from early phase discussions to nuts and bolts negotiations, nation state representatives are likely to narrow their focus on political jockeying, causing opportunities to hear from external stakeholders to decrease.

The entirety of the negotiating process is slated to play out over the next two years with five INC meetings on the calendar. The last scheduled meeting will take place in December 2024 with the hope that a full treaty will be ratified shortly after.

Updates on this effort/process will be provided in the months ahead, hoping it goes to a successful completion.

HOLY FAMILY CARES

Holy Family parishioners have a long history of caring for God's creation. The following initiatives have been established at Holy Family to provide good stewardship for our common home.



- 650 solar panels were installed and dedicated on Earth Day 2021
- Holy Family has recycled close to two tons of plastic bags in the last two years as part of the NextTrex program.
- The Haiti Ministry promotes and sells PeaceCycle products to reduce plastic waste in Haiti.
- With the guidance of Lynnhaven River Now and ARC Landscaping, a drought resistance, native and pollinator garden has been established.
- To reduce plastic use, Holy Family uses reusable flatware, plates, and cups at most events.
- All lighting fixtures have been replaced with energy efficient LED light bulbs.
- During the recent renovation, water fed, high efficiency and energy saving HVAC was installed.
- Vegetable garden provides fresh vegetable to the Food Pantry.
- "Creation Care Corner" provides tips and information about our common home, each week in the bulletin.
- Motion sensor light fixtures have been installed in many of the rooms to reduce energy use.

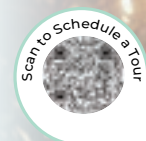
