"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

Among the effective measures available to decrease the prevalence of plastic bags at grocery stores and other businesses would be State Legislation. Reducing plastic bag use can mitigate harmful impacts to oceans, rivers, lakes, forests, and the wildlife that inhabit them. It can also relieve pressure on landfills and waste management. Some states have already imposed bans or fees to discourage the use of plastic bags altogether and others (unfortunately, not Virginia) are considering this legislation.

California became the first state to enact legislation imposing a statewide ban on single-use plastic bags at large retail stores in the November 2016 election.

Hawaii has a de facto statewide ban as all of its most populous counties prohibit non-biodegradable plastic bags at checkout. Honolulu became the last major county to approve the ban in 2015

The third state to ban plastic bags was New York in 2019. The law, which went into effect in March 2020, applies to most single-use plastic bags provided by grocery stores and other retailers. The law there allows individual counties the option of placing a 5 cent fee on paper bags, with 2 cents to local governments and 3 cents to the state's Environmental Protection Fund.

In 2019 five other states passed legislation on this issue: they were Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Oregon, and Vermont. Vermont went further and placed restrictions on single-use straws and polystyrene containers.

Along with these states, some notable cities/counties also issued bans on plastic bags; namely, Boston; Chicago; Los Angeles; Boulder, Colorado; Montgomery County, Maryland; and New York City.

There are efforts being made to have the Virginia Beach City Council legislate a ban on plastic bags. What did these 8 states and 5 cities have that they were successful in obtaining legislature that banned plastic bags? What would it take for our state and our city to get serious about plastic bags and ban them? Worldwide, some 200 countries have agreed to develop a Global Plastics Treaty, which they are in the process of accomplishing. For such a global treaty to be strong, a holistic approach must be ensured to ending the plastic crisis by:

- Limiting plastic production and use
- Changing the ways corporations deliver products with focus on refill and reuse
- Holding corporate polluters accountable
- Demanding full transparency on plastic production, use, import, and export
- Requiring wealthy countries to lead the zero-waste and help others
- Ensuring indigenous peoples, frontline communities, waste pickers, and others affected

Workers have a voice in designing a <u>just</u> transition to a reuse economy.


