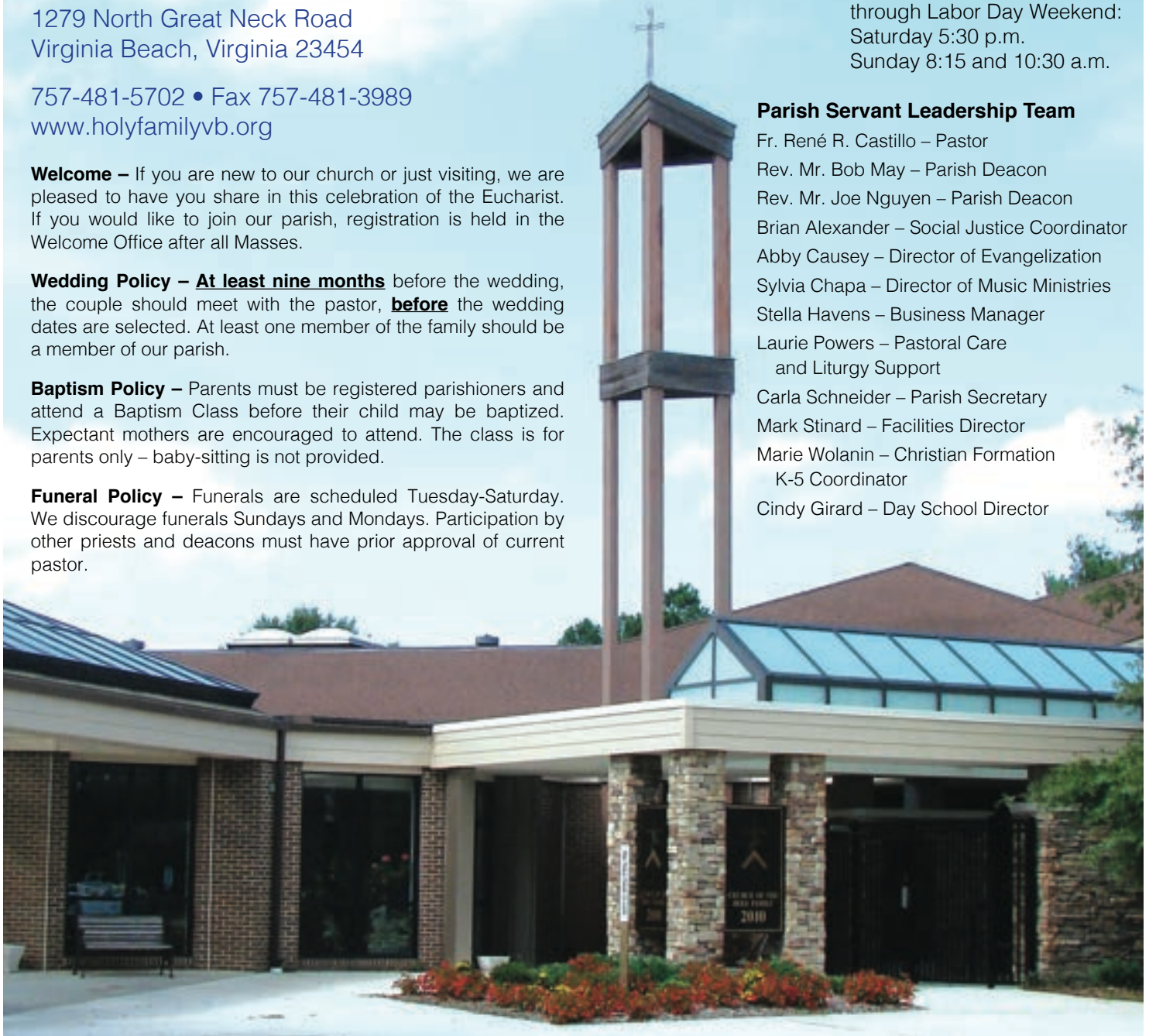

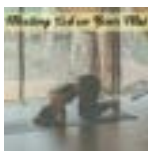

- Those adults who have been baptized in a recognized non-Catholic Christian tradition
- Those adults who were baptized Catholic but have not celebrated Eucharist and Communion

Participating in RCIA does not mean that you **have** to become Catholic, but it does help you discern as to whether God is calling you to join the Catholic Church.

“CREATION CARE CORNER:”

There are a multitude of advantages and disadvantages of nuclear energy and the debate whether to keep this technology or find other alternatives is destined to continue in the years to come.

In the 1950s, early commercial nuclear power stations started operations, offering to many countries an alternative to oil and gas import dependency, and a far less polluting energy source than fossil fuels. Today, nuclear energy meets around 10% of global energy demand, with 439 currently operational nuclear plants in 32 countries and about 55 new reactors under construction. In 2020, 13 countries produced at least 1/4 of their total electricity from nuclear, with the U.S., China, and France dominating the market.

In the 1970s, France embarked on a sweeping expansion of its nuclear power industry with the goal of breaking its dependence on foreign oil. The country was able to build up its economy while simultaneously cutting its emissions at a rate never seen before.

The first and foremost advantage of nuclear energy is its clean energy and it provides pollution-free power with no greenhouse gas emissions. Contrary to what many believe, cooling towers in nuclear plants only emit water vapor and are thus, not releasing any pollutant or radioactive substance in the atmosphere.

A rather important advantage of nuclear energy is that it is much safer than fossil fuels from a public health perspective. The pro-nuclear movement leverages the fact that nuclear waste is not even remotely as dangerous as the toxic chemicals coming from fossil fuels. Indeed, coal and oil act as ‘invisible killers’ and are responsible for 1 in 5 deaths worldwide.

Finally, nuclear energy has some advantage compared to some of the renewable energy sources. According to the U.S. Office of Nuclear Energy, nuclear power has by far the highest capacity factor, with plants requiring less maintenance, capable to operate up to 2 years before refueling and able to produce maximum power more than 90% of the time during the year.

The first disadvantage of nuclear energy is the risk of nuclear proliferation in view of the deadly atomic bombing of the Japanese cities in World War II.

A second disadvantage is that the radioactive nuclear waste contains highly poisonous chemicals like plutonium and uranium pellets used as fuel. These materials can be extremely toxic for tens of thousands of years, needing to be meticulously and permanently disposed of. Knowing the dangers of nuclear waste, many oppose nuclear energy for fears of accidents, despite these being extremely unlikely to happen.

Lastly, if compared to other sources of energy, nuclear power is one of the most expensive and time-consuming forms of energy. Nuclear plants cost billions of dollars to build and take longer than any other infrastructure for renewable energy, sometimes even more than a decade. While nuclear plants are expensive to build, they are relatively cheap to run.

With the recent discovery about nuclear fission, the use of nuclear energy can become more likely a feasible option.

Holy Family Environmental Ministry Visit Drishti Composting

Members of the Holy Family Environmental Ministry took a tour of Drishti Composting in Pungo, Virginia Beach, to learn more about large scale commercial composting. Farmer John Wilson, a long time composter, organic farmer, and founder of Drishti Composting gave the tour. Farmer John explained the importance of food scape composting and the role healthy microbes play in the process. We witnessed the different stages of large scale composting. Holy Family has partnered with Drishti Composting to slowly begin composting at Holy Family. The Holy Family Environmental Ministry is educating themselves about composting and will begin to introduce the composting program to the parish. We are excited to not only reduce landfill waste, but to reduce the need for synthetic fertilizer and create healthy soil that retains water and reduces soil erosion.

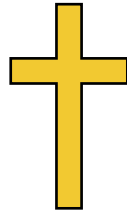

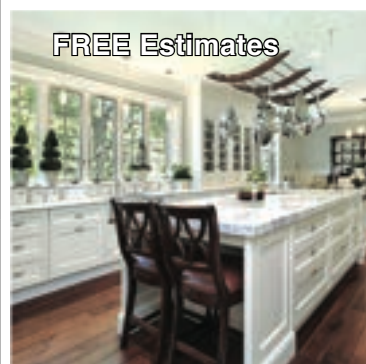
