Executive Director of DignityUSA. The celebrant for Sunday Mass will be Archbishop John Wester and the Homilist will be Father James



Most of you know the story behind PeaceCycle products. The Holy Family Haiti Ministry has been supporting the work of PeaceCycle for the over five years PeaceCycle bags are





made of discarded water pouches collected on the streets of Port au Prince, Haiti. Yolene and her son James are original workers starting the company over ten years ago. Two months ago, their world came to a halt. She received a call that her adult son James (32 years old) was missing and believed to be kidnapped. The next morning, a photo was sent of James with his hands and legs tied and his eyes and mouth wrapped with tape. James is the father of an 18 month old daughter and was the man of the house, supporting his family since he was ten years old. James is a skilled plumber and electrician and often worked many jobs. Without sharing too many details, efforts have been made to bring James home safely but with great sadness there is reason to believe that James is dead. We ask for special prayers for Yolene and her family, including the PeaceCycle Family who is mourning a loss that we cannot fully comprehend. We ask your prayers for the safety of Yolene and her family. The family is now living in a secret location.

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

The last time carbon dioxide levels on our planet were as high as today was more than 4 million years ago. What follows are some interesting climate change facts of which many people are not aware.

- 1. We are Certain we Caused the Climate Change: In 2021, the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) reported that: "It is unequivocal that human influence has warmed the atmosphere, ocean, and land." How are we so certain? Climate modeling is now refined enough to predict how things would go without human influence, within a margin of error. What we are observing today, however, is beyond that margin of error, therefore proving that we have driven the change. In spite of information in circulation like this, there are still those who deny that climate change is human activated.
- 2. The Last Decade was the Hottest in 125,000 Years: According to the IPCC's 6th assessment report on the state of our climate, the past decade is likely to have been the hottest period in the last 125,000 years. For about 100,000 years, we have been oscillating between glacial (ice ages) and warmer interglacial periods like the one we are currently in. Yet, this is also the warmest multicentury period we have had in this time span. Extreme heat like this also affects our water supply.
- **3.** The Cost of Inaction is Higher than the Opposite: On the current path, climate change could end up costing us 11% to 14% of the global GDP by midcentury. It has been proposed that ending climate change would take between \$300 billion and \$50 trillion over the next two decades. Even if \$50 trillion is the price tag, that comes down to \$2.5 trillion a year, or just over 3% of the global GDP.
- **4.** <u>Air Pollution is Both Good and Bad.</u> It was recently found that air pollution kills more than 9 million people per year around our globe. Developing hotspots in South Asia and Africa will be dealing with poor air quality for years to come. The good part is the polluting particles, which cause adverse health effects, similar to those of cigarettes, actually reflect the sun's heat rays rather than trap them. We have pumped enough greenhouse gases into the atmosphere to warm it by 1.5C already, but the fine particles have kept it around 1.1C so far. Ironic, isn't it?
- 5. It Could Become Too Hot to Live in Many Places by the End of the Century: As of now, only 0.8% of the planet's land surface has mean annual temperatures above 29 degrees C mostly in the Sahara desert and Saudi Arabia. A study by Xu in 2020 found that by 2070, these unbearable temperatures could expand to affect up to 3 billion people. Lost work hours are only one example of the impacts of extreme heat, especially when sustained over long periods. Others include agriculture yield losses, the spread of disease-carrying mosquitoes, and the increased need for air conditioning with its accompanying energy consumption.


