

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

Each year, there is approximately 400 tons of plastic produced. Of that, at least 14% goes into bags. Unfortunately, only about 16% of plastic is recycled and the rate for plastic bags is significantly lower. Many local recyclers do not accept bags and we cannot be certain that those we drop off at stores' containers are actually recycled. Granted getting a plastic bag to carry our purchases makes shopping so much quicker. We don't think about the harm those bags are doing to our environment and even our health. Studies have found that it takes up to 2,000 years or more for plastic to completely decompose. Even then, dangerous micro-plastics form and enter our food supply, among other areas of life. If we need reasons to switch from plastic bags to reusable

If we need reasons to switch from plastic bags to reusable ones like canvas and cloth, here are some:

- Plastic bags kill up to around 100,000 animals yearly, many of them in our waterways.
- The production of plastic bags drains the supply of petroleum and causes a rise in oil prices
- There is a large amount of water used in the production of plastic and in many areas of the world, water is a precious item.
- Help future generations have a cleaner environment.
- The BPA product found in plastic can lead to health problems of cancer, among other diseases.

July has been declared "Plastic-Free Month!" Millions of people throughout the globe will be celebrating by avoiding plastic items, some days or every day of July. In 2022, plastic-free participants reduced plastic waste by 2.6 million tons (the weight of 13 blue whales). The theme for the event is "Small Steps, Big Differences!"

Using cloth, canvas, or some reusable bag when you shop instead of the plastic bags stores provide could be one way to make July a plastic-free month!

Another would be swapping from individually-packaged snacks to unpackaged treats, going to a bulk store, where snacks are now stored in glass containers and washable tongs are used to gather them.

UPDATE ON ST JUDE CHURCH RENOVATION IN BAPTISTE HAITI

On November 9, 2021, an earthquake damaged the church at our twining parish of St. Jude in Baptiste Haiti. The Church required major re-enforcing. Thanks to the generosity of the Holy Family parishioners, structural repairs have been made. Columns and walls have been secured. The roof is complete and the flooring and altar are now being installed.











The ceramic tiles for the flooring and altar have arrived and installation has begun. The creation of the Two stain glass windows above the altar has begun.

The side windows of the church will be glass and the windows will be able to open. Opening glass windows in Baptiste is very uncommon. The final phase is to complete the interior roof, install electricity for chandeliers. The cost for phase three is \$18,000 USD. Currently, there is no fund raising plan for phase three. At this time the Haiti Committee does not have the funds for this project. Fr. Ronel hopes to have the church ready for the Feast of St. Jude on October 28, 2023.


