"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

SOIL - PART IV

The last three weeks' articles on "Keeping the Magic of Soil Alive" ended with an explanation of why soil is such a valuable resource for our planet.



When considering the

benefits of healthy soil, the urgency of introducing policies to restore a minimum of 3-6% organic matter in agricultural soil becomes apparent and necessary. Governments must implement policies for soil rejuvenation and conservation.

Sadhguru, one of the most influential people of our time and a best-selling author, maintains that this can only happen by implementing a 3-pronged strategy;

- First, world governments need to incentivize farmers to raise the organic matter in their soil. (This is what Farmer John Wilson is doing at his Drishti Project in Pungo. Our parish has joined this project by becoming a collection station for food waste, which is then taken to the farm, where it is processed and transformed into rich, fertile soil through composting.)
- Second, world governments must simplify the carbon credit market so that it is accessible to the farmers
- The third part of the strategy calls for market recognition and valuation of the produce as per the organic matter of the soil, which it comes from.

Sadhguru, in his travels around the globe, has said that "the whole world knows that the soil must be revitalized and I am sure that policies will be implemented almost everywhere." He claims that "everyone knows there is a serious problem and all know the general direction of the solution."


