

PART-TIME EARLY CHILDHOOD AND OCIC COORDINATOR:

Church of the Holy Family seeks a part-time coordinator of Baptisms, CLOW (Children's Liturgy of the Word), Sunday Nursery, and OCIC (Order of Christian Initiation of Children). Duties include overseeing our ongoing Baptismal preparation program, CLOW program during the school year, ongoing OCIC program, and establishment of a Sunday Nursery during the Masses. This coordinator will work under the supervision of the Director of Elementary Religious Education to carry out all responsibilities. This coordinator will work closely with families to provide information and facilitate their participation in all these programs. The coordinator will oversee, train, and recruit catechists to run effective and engaging Baptism, CLOW, Nursery, and OCIC programs. The coordinator will work with clergy and other staff to organize and administer programming. He or she will make sure that sacramental guidelines are followed and that necessary documentation for sacraments is collected and recorded.

Requirements include basic knowledge of Catholic sacramental theology, in particular the Sacraments of Initiation. The coordinator should have experience in sacramental formation and demonstrate pastoral skills and deep respect for cultural diversity. The coordinator will have strong communication skills with adults and children alike and be successful working in a team setting. The position also requires the ability to work independently. Given the position and its responsibilities in our parish, the coordinator needs to be a Catholic in good standing and must be VIRTUS-trained or eligible for VIRTUS-training.

FOLLOW YOUR VOCATION TO SERVE:

Do you think you may be called to serve the Church in a new role? The Office of the Permanent Diaconate is hosting three informational sessions this fall for men who might have a calling to ordained service to the Church and to the bishop as a permanent deacon, and are interested in discerning their calling while learning about the commitment it involves.

Qualifications for formation to the permanent diaconate include, but are not limited to the following:

- A Roman Catholic for a minimum of five years at time of application.
- Registered parishioner within the Diocese of Richmond for five years at the time of application, and active in the parish community.
- Between the ages of 30 and 59 at the time of application.
- Committed to and living out values of justice, charity, and service.
- Demonstrates grateful fidelity to all that the Church teaches, openness to formation, and has demonstrated leadership.

Following these sessions, a new cohort of permanent deacons will be formed in 2024. Our permanent deacons are assigned to a parish where they exercise liturgical and catechetical ministries within their parish communities. Deacons hold roles both in their church and in a variety of secular professions, showing how unique this vocation is. Please prayerfully discern whether you may be called to join a thriving and essential vocation to serve the Church in a new way. "CREATION CARE CORNER:"

Increased efforts to make ready for the acute threat of climate change are happening. Among these preparations is the building of climate resilient communities. Climate change is a major threat to billions of people around the globe. Roughly, 40% of the world's population is vulnerable to the effects of global warming due to their location. Climate resilient communities cannot stop global warming entirely, but the resilient design can help people lead healthier, happier lives. Resilient communities are designed to weather the proverbial storm and help folks pick up their lives after an extremely disastrous climate event.

The Elizabeth River Project on Colley Avenue in Norfolk is in the process of constructing a living lab for environmentally sustainable construction practices with changing research displays and a waterside learning park to help people and businesses explore how to live and work in a coastal flood plain as seas rise.

Resilient communities are economically robust and are built to adapt to rapidly changing markets when catastrophes occur. This means that people who live in areas affected by climate change can pivot towards a more sustainable, low-impact way of life without having to compromise their individual goals and dreams.

Climate resilient communities are built with durable and sustainable building designs. These designs place a premium on hardiness and incorporate design elements like:

- Deep, well-built foundations to weather high winds and earthquakes;
- Pliable materials that are designed to withstand extreme weather events;
- Alternative forms of power (solar, etc.) to reduce reliance on national grids;
- Improved thermal efficiency to keep buildings cool in summer and warm in the winter.

Resilient design is inherently sustainable, too. Resilient buildings are structures that will last multiple generations. They also use less energy.

Along with resilient houses, the infrastructure that supports vulnerable populations must be improved to meet the demands of tomorrow.

Sustainable construction materials like bendable concrete must be used. Bendable concrete is designed to be shock resistant and is infused with carbon dioxide, which strengthens the concrete and reduces carbon emissions.

We all need to adapt our lifestyles as temperatures rise. Governments can improve the resiliency of local communities by funding public education and improving infrastructure. Progress in dealing with and mitigating the effects of climate change is happening.




