"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

In 2015, Pope Francis wrote Laudato Si, the first Magisterial Encyclical to focus primarily on climate change. It was timed intentionally to be released ahead of the groundbreaking United Nations' climate change conference, known as COP21 and held in Paris, in which 200 nations entered into a historic agreement to reduce carbon emissions.

Since then, the Pope has continued to use his decade-long papacy to urge for greater environmental action, though responses to both Laudato Si and his prioritization of creation care issues according to Christopher White, Vatican Correspondent, have (sadly) been mixed (mostly ignored), especially among the leadership of the U. S. Catholic Church.

Pope Francis will be releasing a follow-up document on the environment on October 4, providing an update to his 2015 encyclical on "Care for Our Common Home." Francis said that the new document, an apostolic exhortation, is an effort to help "put an end to the senseless war against our common home" and will come after a summer of record-breaking rising temperatures, wildfires, and storms. Few other details have emerged about the content of the document with the Vatican Press Office only stating that the document will address "the most recent extreme weather events and catastrophes affecting people across five continents."

October 4, the release date, of course, coincides with two other events: it is the Feast day of the Pope's namesake, Francis of Assisi, the 12th century saint known for his concern for the poor and the environment. And it is also the date of the final day of what is known as the "Season of Creation," a monthlong ecumenical initiative aimed at inspiring greater prayer and environmental action among people.

Let's be on the lookout for this document!

It is the first organization of its kind-----a joining of hearts and hands of the descendants of enslaved ancestors and the present successors of Jesuit enslavers.




