Participating in RCIA does not mean that you <u>have</u> to become Catholic, but it does help you discern as to whether God is calling you to join the Catholic Church.

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

Water is one of the most important natural resources on this planet sustaining life in many ways. It helps us, among other things, to create and sustain food. Our planet does something remarkable in providing us with water in our oceans, rivers, lakes, and even wetlands.

When we think of all these amazing bodies of water that sustain life, we don't often think of wetlands. But you'd be amazed to learn about everything they do. Despite covering just 6% of the earth's land surface, wetlands provide food, clean drinking water, and refuge for countless people and wild life around the world. Today, an estimated half of all wetlands have disappeared because of some people's greed, disregard, or ignorance. There are 5 different types of wetlands. They can be recognized from other types of land primarily by the vegetation that has adapted to wet soil and are categorized according to their location, water chemistry, animal life, and more. These types are known as:

- 1. Marine Wetlands (by oceans)
- 2. Riverine Wetlands (by rivers)
- 3. Estuarine Wetlands (by estuaries)
- 4. Lacustrine Wetlands (by lakes)
- 5. Palustrine Wetlands (by marshes)

The importance of wetlands are that they can store flood water. In a world where floods are becoming increasingly common, the need for wetlands is apparent. An acre of wetlands can store anywhere from 1 to 1.5 million gallons of flood water, becoming a natural buffer during storm surges.

Wetlands absorb excess nutrients, sediments, and other polutants, before they reach rivers, lakes, and other water bodies. Formerly thought of as useless swamps, they are also home to abundant fish and wildlife.

Wetlands control erosion. They do this by reducing the pressure of storm water on the soil, thus reducing the likelihood of landslides and other negative events.

Understanding all the incredible things that wetlands do for us only highlights how important it is to protect them. Planting trees near wetlands helps to enrich wildlife habitat and reduce disturbance from human activities.

We also protect them when we advocate against land development in their regions.

7 reasons why a Plastic Bag Fee makes good sense for Virginia Beach

- Virginians use nearly 3 billion bags annually, and they are one of the most commonly littered items in Virginia Beach.
- Billions of plastic bags end up in landfills, farm fields, and waterways. They never completely go away, and they break down into microplastics that contaminate our air, food, and wildlife.
- Recycling and trash clean-ups are not enough to solve our plastic pollution problem.
- The 5 cent bag fee only applies when shoppers choose to use plastic bags. If a family used 100 plastic bags a year, it would cost \$5.
- Reducing plastic bag usage promotes social equity because plastic pollution more greatly impacts low-income communities. Cities can use the fee to provide free reusable bags to those in need.
- To decrease plastic pollution, 84% of Virginians are willing to use reusable bags instead of single-use bags according to the 2022 VA Marine Debris Reduction Plan report.
- Our neighbors, Alexandria City, Arlington County, Fairfax City, Fairfax County, Falls Church City, Fredericksburg City, Loudon County, Roanoke City, Albemarle County, and Charlottesville City have adopted the Plastic Bag Fee.

Email from Fr. Roderick in Belladere Haiti Describes the Chaos and Violence

The following email was forwarded to Holy Family from Paul Fletcher, whose church Saint Mary's in Suffolk, VA twins with a church in Belladere Haiti. Belladere is the town "down the mountain" from Holy Family's twinning parish of Baptiste. Mirebalais Haiti is a three-hour drive from our twining parish in Baptiste Haiti.

Brothers and Sisters,

Good Morning. On the night of September 29, 2023, a powerful group of well-armed gangs invaded the town of Saut d'Eau. They killed many people, traumatized the population, looted and burned the city's house and banks, even the police suffered the same fate. It was a long and terrible night for the people. They took over Mirebalais's University Hospital where they swept away and broke everything in their path. I have to tell you that the entire region and parishes have been on red alert. All priests as well as many families with children had to abandon their homes, to save their lives. Fortunately arriving in Mirebalais the bandits found strong resistance and were unable to penetrate the town. The population killed many of them. At the moment, people are still traumatized. In Belladere, people are alerted and forming surveillance brigades. Some schools operate timidly. The border between the Dominican Republic and Haiti is still closed. I recommend your prayers for the Haitian people and for the priests in difficulty in the Dioceses of Hinche.

Please keep all the people of Haiti in your prayers and know that your support of our twinning parish in Baptiste Haiti over these many years has helped provide a healthier, stronger community that seeks God for protection and encouragement.






