"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

Water scarcity is a growing issue with the presence of climate change. Finding long-term solutions to water scarcity is becoming more and more important, because everything that is alive depends upon water to survive. This article checks out four areas regarding water that would be long-term solutions to scarcity.

*INFRASTRUCTURE: According to the United Nations, 100-200bn cubic meters of water could be saved by 2030 in urban areas simply by reducing leaks. An example would be the **smart-water management system** utilized in South Korea, which helps improve the reliability, soundness and efficiency of water management.

- <u>Irrigation And Agriculture</u>: According to a World Economic Forum report, sustainable and efficient agricultural management techniques "are needed to grow more food on less land and with less water." Not entirely free of detrimental effects, reservoirs collect water during wetter times and store it for use during dry seasons. They also are used to generate electricity and can be a crucial instrument in the prevention of floods. Also, individual households can consider reusing water by re-routing sink water to flush the toilet.
- <u>Conservation:</u> An incomprehensible amount of water is wasted each year, mostly indirectly through agricultural processes, the automotive industry, and mining. According to the World Water Council, water usage via irrigation and agriculture accounts for 70% of water withdrawals, while industry accounts for 20%.
- <u>Community:</u> Building communities around local water systems and resources can help raise awareness and educate people on consumption and a sustainable lifestyle. Educating people on changing or improving their behavior for the better could hold the key to greatly reducing water crises in the future.

offering hospitality to homeless women. They serve breakfast to the homeless among the community and seek peaceful and non-violent solution to today's problems.




DID YOU KNOW?




